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Identify and understand the main points, ideas and details in texts

There are two parts to what this subject content statement is asking: To identify the main points and ideas.

How the main points and ideas are presented

Firstly, you need to know the type of text you are reading. Here are some of the main examples you will see:

> Letter, Email, Leaflet, Form, Brochure, Article, Notice, Report, Review and Advertisement

However, you also need to be able to identify the purpose of the text. There are four main purposes for a text you may come across:

- 1. Persuasive
- 2. Informative
- 3. Instructive
- 4. Descriptive

You also need to know:

- 1. Presentational features of text types
- 2. Language features of text types

The table on the next page gives some examples of text types, purposes and possible language features.
