## About this qualification

This qualification is part of a suite designed to provide learners with underpinning skills and knowledge in English. Learners will develop their skills in:

- speaking, listening and communication
- reading
- writing

The qualification has been designed to map to the subject content for Functional Skills but splits the learning into smaller units and is assessed by a portfolio of evidence, so that it provides learners with skills that can be used in their everyday life or support them to progress on to an entry level 2 qualification in Functional Skills.

To be awarded this qualification, learners are required to successfully achieve 8 mandatory units.
