External Quality Assurer guidance has also been provided for each piece of evidence relating to an assessment criterion. The guidance comments on how the evidence meets the assessment criterion and what could be improved to obtain a higher grade.

## Learner Evidence

### Unit 1 – Investigate interactive media production

#### LO1: Understand what is required for the development of an interactive media product.

##### Features of an Interactive Media Product

###### Features

**House style** - House style is a set of rules which states how all documents are written and how communication from a business should be formatted. This is a good interactive feature because it means the audience can read and understand what the interactive product is saying so they could find out where they are supposed to do or what they want to know about the school. House style makes the product more professional, house style includes where your logo is on the page or it could include what font or colours are being used in the interactive media product. House style would be used in an interactive media product to make sure that the colours, fonts and layout of the pages meet the requirements for the audience, purpose and clients.

**Colour scheme** - Colour scheme is what colour's you are going to use and whether each page is going to have specific colour's or if the whole document will have similar colour's. This is an interactive feature because if each page has a different Colour it will make the user get really attached with the document so therefore the user won't get bored. The colour scheme links in with house style because if the document had a specific home style then the colour scheme has got to meet the same house style for the document to look professional. An example of a colour scheme would be to have the same colour throughout the product or to have different colours that related to the audience and purpose. A colour scheme will be used to make the product look professional and interesting for the user also it would be used to make the product engaging so the user wants to use the product.

**Typography** - is the style and appearance of the text. this interactive feature is good because the font and how the text looks will engage the user making them want to use the kiosk. Typography could include different text styles, colour of the text or they could have the same colour text font with the same size throughout the entire interactive media product. Typography would be used in an interactive media product because text would be able to tell the user about the location and then people could read the information at their own pace, it could also be used to make it look engaging and professional.

**Roll overs** - roll overs is when the user hovers over a link and then another link or some text will appear about the thing that they have clicked on this is a really good interactive feature because it keeps the user engaged and this would make them want to use the console. An example of a roll over would be putting the mouse over a button on a navigation bar and a drop down menu appearing or the button that the mouse is on could change colour to indicate that the user is on the page. Roll overs can be used on an interactive media product to tell the user what page that they are on or it could be used to play a video or activate a link inside the product.

**Links** - links are writing that takes you to a different page or a different part of the website and back to the page that the user have come off of. I think this is a really good interactive feature because the user can go from one page easily making it really quick and useful for the user. There could be internal links which are links to other pages in the interactive media product or there could be external links which are links to a different website that is not in the product for example: there could be a link to a YouTube video. Internal links could be used in an interactive media product to get from one page to another page in the interactive media product which is important otherwise the user would stuck on one page and not able to move to other pages of the interactive media product however I do not think that external links are going to be important because it could draw their attention away from the product also the user may not need to come off of the document as it may have all of the information

**Interactive elements** - Interactive elements are elements that the user can have control over for example: a pause/play button on an iPad the user is in control of when he/she would like to play and pause the program. I think interactive elements are important for an interactive media product because it allows the user to be in control of the product making it so they can find information without having to watch a video and standing there until they get to the information the user would

*Like to find out. Interactive elements such as animations, moving pictures, animations between the different pages are important because they will keep the user engaged also it would be important as the client may have asked for it to be interesting and have interactive elements.*

**Navigation bar** - a navigation bar is a bar on the side of the screen allowing the user to get from one page to another page. I think a navigation bar is beneficial because it means that the user is in control of what information they would like to find out also it saves the user time and ensures that they do not get bored using the product. Navigation bars are important because they allow the user to get in between the pages clearly also if the navigation bars had a drop-down menu then the user could see if that is the correct page for the information that they are looking for.

**Hit counter** - a hit counter is a piece of code that is built into the main website to track visitors. I think this is a good feature for an interactive media product because it allows the owner to make any necessary updates to the site to ensure people come back or more people use the website. Hit counters track visitors so that the owner of the website can see if their website is a success and so they can make necessary changes based on the pages are visited most often.

### **Processes involved in Interactive Media Products**

**Storyboards** can be used to plan what is going to be on the product and they can be used to plan what is going to happen in the video, this will contribute to the interactive media product because it will help the creator to know what information to put in the product and the order the pages are in, when using a storyboard you can annotate certain parts of the pictures to illustrate your points also you can comment on the colours of the product and you can make it clear as to what you are going to do on the video and animations that are going to be included in the interactive media product.

Storyboards can link to mood boards as the creator can build on some of the ideas that have been shown in the mood board also it means that you can clearly down what is going to happen in the product. It can also link to scripts as you can plan your animations and videos in more detail before you start creating what you are going to say. Coding links to storyboards because if you do not plan out what is going to happen in the product otherwise it will get very confusing, so this section is key to the coding of the product. It also linked to testing as you have to test your product and if it does not look right or doesn't work, it means that you then have to go back through your designs and figure out what went wrong and how it can be sorted.

**Mood boards** can be used to show the colour schemes and images that will be used in the product. This will contribute to the interactive media product because it will help the creator clearly see the images and colours that the client would want. Also, the mood boards could be shown to the client to make sure that they are happy with the choices of colour and pictures that are going to be on the interactive media product also on mood boards notes can be written on separate paper and stuck to it, so the creator knows exactly how to put the interactive media product together. Mood boards can be used to show the things that are going to be used in a video for the interactive media product. Mood boards can be used to help gather ideas for the interactive media product

Moodboards can link to storyboards, scripts and coding because you have to create the script, storyboards and moodboards so that you can follow the designs when coding the interactive media product. Moodboards will help to collect ideas together for all of the above areas. You will be able to plan out and gather inspiration about the different areas and this will help to plan them in more detail using a storyboard and script. The coding will be built on all of these areas and make it much more interesting.

**Scripts** can be used to plan out the kind of things that are going to be on the pages of the interactive media also scripts could be used to plan voice overs or what is going to be said in the video that could go into the interactive media product, this will contribute to the interactive media product because it would make you look professional as you would know what you were talking about and it would mean that your speech would flow throughout the interactive media product. It also saves time and make the recording easier.

Scripts link to storyboards because you would want to develop the sound and music for your videos and a script allows you build on the ideas that you have already planned in your storyboards also mood boards link scripts because it lets your develop your ideas and start to plan out exactly what is going to be in your product and what is not going to be in your product.

**Risk analysis** can be used to plan out all of the possible negative outcomes so that everyone knows what could go wrong during the process and so that people would be able to watch out for the risks and stay safe when filming as they know what could go wrong during the filming. This contributes to the interactive media product because it will mean that the people filming and making the product would know all of the possible negative outcomes when making the product. It could also be the users using the computers for too long and hurting their eyes, it could also be the users using the equipment that they would be using could be dangerous or if they were using a camera

*and they didn't know how to use it properly then they could end up hurting their eyes or someone else's eyes also if they were using a hole punch or a stapler then they could catch their fingers in the stapler or hole punch.*

*Risk analysis links to coding, scripts and storyboards because you need to find out whether you can certain things safely also you need to consider the risks of everything because if you decide to go filming a school and you fall over you could not only hurt yourself, but the camera could get damaged meaning that you cannot film anything without getting it fixed which could delay the production of your product.*

**Flowcharts** can be used to show how you move from one page to another page it is also so good because the creator could annotate on the flowchart of what animations they would want to use. Also, they can be used to plan everything clearly and make sure all of the information is in the right places. This contributes to the planning of the interactive media product as it is clear and useful, and everyone can see the transitions and pages clearly also it could be used to show what is going to be on the pages, so people can easily see how the product is going to flow and the order of the pages.

*Flowcharts links to storyboards because it allows the creator to plan out exactly how someone or something is going to do. Also a flowchart can link to the risk analysis because you have to plan out and find all of the possible risks for example: if you had a flowchart of someone making a cup of tea then a risk that you have to consider is how are going to boil the kettle safely so if you were to film the product then you would have to make sure that there are no safety issues that will affect your safety or the filming of the product. A flowchart will help plan out each of the sections meaning that you would know much time to spend on each stage because if you spend too long on one section then users could quite easily lose interest in the product and walk off.*

**Coding** can be used to make the product and make all of the interactive media features in the program of your choice also it can be used to make sure all of the transitions work together. This contributes to an interactive media product because it where the making of the product happens. Coding can be used to try out new things and experiment with the different features following the design plans that have been made, also if something in the plan does not look right in the product then the person making it can change the transitions or colours to make the product look right.

*Coding links to scripts, moodboards and the storyboard stages as these make it clear as to where you need to start to create your product also you need to code your product to make it is interactive and useful to the client.*

**Testing** can be used to check to see if the product works and there are no mistakes or errors in the program. It can also be used to change something that doesn't work in the product and to review the product to make sure that there are no errors inside the code. This contributes to the making of the product as the program would be tested to make sure that there is nothing wrong with the code, interactive features and animations work properly. These steps have to be followed in the correct order because the testing relies on the coding and the coding relies on the testing because if something goes wrong in the test then you have to go back and edit the code to make it work. Is it important to test your product using something called "Iterative testing" which means that you would test your code as you go through the product so then it makes it easier to fix the errors as you could know where they are whereas if you test it at the end of the product there could be lots of errors that you would have to go through and find which would take longer also it is linked to flowcharts, mood boards, storyboards and scripts because it means that you can test all of your designs and plans to find out if they work.

### **Techniques Involved in Interactive Media Products**

**Sound editing** is used to create an interactive media product because it allows the owner to make songs to play throughout the interactive media product, this is an important feature because the music would keep the user engaged with the interactive media product, however it could be a bad idea because the user could get distracted by the songs therefore they will not gain any information from the interactive media product.

Sound editing links to video editing because the sound that you are editing you are going to use in the video that you make. It's important to make sure that the sounds you edit are going to work in the video that you want to use in your product. Sound editing also links to animation because the sound that you make might also be used within an animation. Sometimes the sounds that you edit could be used in your final product, for example when you click on a correct or wrong answer in a quiz. This means that your sound must again be suitable to be used.

**Animating** is used in an interactive media product because if you animate a page the user is going to use the interactive media product because it is engaging and does not make the user bored from using the product, this is an important feature because it will keep the writing to a minimal so the user does not have to stand there and read a lot of writing as the user will lose interest in the product and not use the product again so, animations are important in the interactive media product

*Animating links to video editing because you might want to animate text that will come into your video to explain what you are talking about also animating could link to the interactive media authoring software because you could animate a logo or picture that you would use in your final product. This means the animations, text and pictures must be suitable for the audience and purpose. Video editing is used to create an interactive media product because if the video was too long or went in the wrong places then you can cut out the not very good bits of the video however, if the video was too long then the user could easily get bored of someone talking therefore they would just walk off and figure it out themselves so that is why you need video editing to edit the videos that you would want to put in your documents, I would use movie maker or iMovie to put my video together, I think this feature is useful for the editing and making part of the interactive media product which will have a good effect on the product also if the video hasn't been edited properly then users could lose interest in the product. Video editing links to image manipulation and animating because you might want to use the images that you edit in the animation and then you could use the animated edited image in the video to explain or show what you are talking about, sound editing can also link to video editing because you might want to use the sound in the video to keep the audience interested instead of them listening to the sound of a boring voice.*

*Image manipulation is used to create an interactive media product because the images can be manipulated to match a high frequency or a different resolution. I would use Photoshop or flash to manipulate the images. I think image manipulation is a good feature to use for the making of the interactive media product, so all the pictures look clear, professional and engaging for the user to look at.*

*Image manipulation can link into video editing because you might want to use the images that you have edited in the video to help explain what they are saying also this would keep the audience engaged because they would be able to see the images and understand what is being said. Image manipulation also links to animating because you might want to use the image that you have manipulated in an animation to then put into a video.*

*Interactive media authoring software is the software that is used to make an interactive media product, for example: mediator or Dreamweaver. I think this is an important feature because when you make the product you can try out the effects for the product also you can make sure all of the information is correct and looks professional. This feature is important because it is where all of the planning of the product can be made to fit the audience and*

*purpose also when making the product the ideas can be changed as they may not work or look right in the interactive media product.*

*Interactive media authoring software links to image manipulation, video editing, animating and sound editing because when you make the product all of these separate things get combined so they can be put into the final product because you can use the manipulated images to help the user to understand what you are saying also you could have a quiet background sound to keep the users engaged. As all of these elements are coming together in the final product you will have to make sure that it definitely suitable for the audience and purpose.*

## **Sources for Interactive Media Products**

### **The internet**

1. First I would type into a sensible and reliable search engine (for example: google) images of valley park school or facts about Valley Park School.
2. Then I would scroll down and look through most of the websites to find the correct information, for example: I would use the Valley park website as it would be easier to find out information that would match the design brief.
3. Finally I would put the information into my own words on my product and I would reference on my product where the information has come from by copying the link for the website that I used and any images that are from google that I have used would have to be put into an asset table to reference where they come from.

### **Books**

1. First I would go to the library or book store and have a look for books that are relevant to what I need to know for my interactive media product.
2. Then I would sit down and look through these books to find out any information also I could photocopy the pages that require so I have a paper copy to take home depending on where I got the book from also I can scan the pages onto a computer and then crop the images down so I have an electronic version of the document.
3. Finally I would write the information down in my own words and reference where I got the book, what book and the page numbers of the book also if there were any images in these books that were relevant then I would put them into an asset table to reference the images.

### **Technical manuals**

1. I would go to the library or bookstore (if I did not have a technical manual) and find a technical manual that was relevant to what I needed to use. For example: a photoshop manual could be used to help me when I am editing my images that are going to be in my interactive media product.
2. Next I would read through the information and pick out key parts to help me also I could photocopy the parts of the books that I would need.
3. Finally I would reference where I got the information from and I would use an asset table to reference all of my images that I have used from these books.

### **Magazines**

1. I would go to the Library and find a range of magazines that would help me complete my product.
2. Then I would look through the information and photocopy the pages and images that I would require
3. Finally I would reference where I got the information from and I would use an asset table to reference all of images that I have used from the magazines

In my opinion I think magazines are unreliable because the information may not be correct or the information could be biased therefore you could be using false information also if you were going to use a magazine then I would make sure I had a second source to back up what I am saying in my interactive media product.



## **Health and Safety**

### **Data protection act 1998**

The data protection act has been made to protect personal and private data of someone who's info has been stored on a computer. It applies to personal data such as bank details, name, address, ext. the act states that the data should be processed in accordance with the rights of the data subject. The acts main job is to prevent data theft. If you are making a kiosk- you need to keep the users' data safe, that is our responsibility should they give us their name or a form. This means that the kiosk needs to be secure and on a well-protected program not just lying out on an easily hackable document or on a system anyone can view and take at their own will or guarded by a person who is untrustworthy and will lose or take the information for himself. In order to comply with this act, we will store the information on only one system that is protected with anti-hacking software and a firewall that only one trusted person can get through with a complex password and proof of authentication. For my product all the information will be saved on that product and that product alone, in a safe and secure way. I will also safely dispose of any information that I don't need and only save what information is absolutely necessary.

### **Computer misuse act 1998**

The perused misuse act was made to help protect computers against malicious attacks and of theft of information. The main offences the act recognises are; getting computer materials without the owner's permission (looking at other files without consent), getting perused materials without permission with further malicious intent (hacking into a data base and stealing confidential info), and changing data without permission (damaging companies and organisation by altering data to cause chaos or delays to their systems). The acts main job is to prevent black hat hacking. This will affect our product because if you need the user to enter something like a name we will need to make sure the person entering the data isn't someone pretending to be someone else so there will be a password system in place also to reduce the risk of all our data getting corrupted or stolen the precautions put in place to comply with the data protection act will help to prevent this. I am the only person who knows my username and password, and my password is as secure as it can be, and I change it regularly to avoid someone guessing my password or learning it and using it against my permission.

### **Copyright, design and patents act 1988**

This act is designed to stop people stealing others work and claiming it as their own. The copyright, design and patents act are the current copyright law in the UK, it gives creators of products that are openly available for others to view or download, the right to control he way material and content they have created can be used. If you want to use something that is subject to copyright, you would need to ask the owner's permission first or reference them in your product with an address or name(s) or you cannot use it. The acts main job is preventing theft of content. This will affect us as we need to gather information from various different sites so that we can be sure our work is the best it can be and is all correct, and as we don't have enough time to go around asking every site for permission, I will reference any sites I used for this project in my portfolio. However, I will only use others information when absolutely necessary and any information that I do use will be put into my own words to ensure that my work is mine and mine alone, additionally I will reference any group work that I take part in as that work will belong to all the members of the group and not just me.

### **Health and safety at work act 1974**

The health and safety at work act is the main piece of UK health and safety legislation and it makes sure all employers are giving their employees' health and safety at work. The act requires that all

employers should; Provide tiltable screens, Provide anti-glare screen filters, Provide adjustable chairs, Provide foot supports, Make sure lighting is suitable, Make sure there is sufficient space for people to work, Train employees how to use work stations correctly, Ensure employees have sufficient breaks, Pay for regular eye sight tests for anyone who needs prescription glasses in order to use the equipment. The acts main job is to ensure employees are safe. This act does not directly apply to me as I am a student however, I will be complying with some of the acts points in order to ensure my own well-being whilst creating my product meaning that my product will be the best product that it could possibly be. The school's computers have adjustable and antiglare screens and the computer rooms are always well lit, this is because if you are looking at a screen for too long it could damage your eyes if they don't provide these things. At school we all have guidelines to follow in regards to how we use and treat the school computers so we all know how to use our computers and workstations to their fullest extent and not cause harm to ourselves or others, this is because if we didn't know how to use our stations properly it could lead us hurting ourselves or others and we only work for an hour at a time twice a week as these are when our lessons are, if we didn't have sufficient breaks between our work then we would get exhausted and it could lead to other medical problems and our work not being of a high quality or standard.

#### Health and safety (display screen equipment regulations) 1992

These regulations apply to all display screen equipment- for example perused screens. The main provisions are that employers must carry out a risk assessment of workstations used by employees, they must ensure that employees take adequate breaks from looking at their screens, the employer has to ensure that employees have regular eye sight tests for anyone who needs prescription glasses in order to use the equipment, and keep written records of who receives free eye tests, the dates and costs of the tests, and they must also provide their computer users with adequate health and safety training for any workstation they work at. The acts main job is to ensure employees are safe and do not get into any workplace injuries. This affects our work because if you are looking at a screen for too long it could damage your eyes and causes headaches and if a person has glasses the company should pay for regular test to make sure their condition is getting worse. It prevents tiredness caused by poorly designed workstations, and breaks help ensure that injuries like repetitive strain injury don't affect the employees. The school provides solutions to most of these issues, but these regulations do not apply to students in schools only in workplaces. I will make sure that I take regular breaks, my desk is clear and that I am comfortable whilst completing the tasks. I will also make sure that I adjust the blinds in the classroom.

## **Audience and Purpose**

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### Audience

My product will be mainly aimed at New year seven students, male and female also it will be aimed at students who are already at the school, parents, visitors and new teachers because they are going to want to know roughly where everything is. My audience interests are going to be finding about the school and their way around the school. I will have to think about catering for all these age groups when making my product as it will have to be user friendly and professional. I will have to think about the gender and make sure the colour scheme is sensible and have colours that are not just aimed at one gender.

### Purpose

The purpose of my product is to help new year sevens, existing students, parents, visitors and new teachers find their way around the school. They would also learn about the community they or their children are entering, also as there are a wide range of options from after school activities to options for the next stages of the students life after year 8. My product will also have a map to help students find there way around the school this will meet my purpose objective.

However this might not be very suitable because if students are lost then they could get confused trying to find the kiosk also it could be very busy around the kiosk meaning someone could get hurt.

I would use this to make the students less confused about their way around the school, however this would cause problems because it could cause a blockage where they are having to wait around for the correct section of the video causing the students to be delayed getting to their next lesson.

**Apps:**

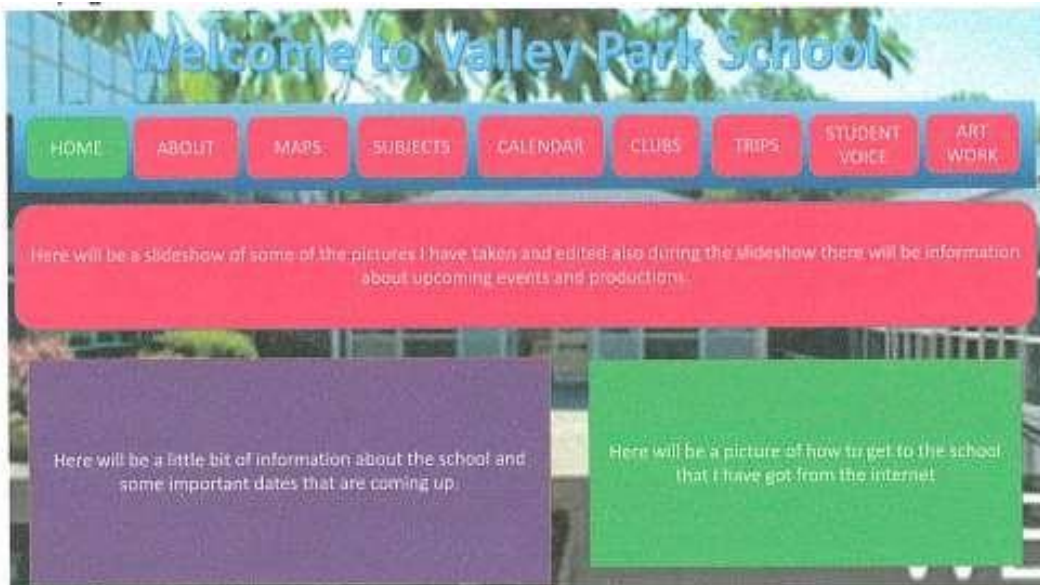

In my opinion I think this is not the best design because most of the reception in the background is covered up also the title cannot be seen very clearly because the colour behind it is much brighter than the title causing the title to not be seen as clearly so I think if I was going to use this design I would have to change the title and I would have to make it so the image is not completely cover up the image so the users do not get confused as to what the image is, however I think people with autism and dyslexia may find it hard to read what is in the boxes because they are quite bright meaning people with autism and dyslexia may find that it hurts their eyes and they could have trouble focusing on the pages.



I like this design because I think it is really professional and not as bright as the first design therefore meaning that users with autism or dyslexia can use it without hurting their eyes where they are straining to read the information in the boxes. In my opinion I think this design meets the audience because all users can use it without damaging their eyes also this colour scheme meets the audience



as it will appeal to everyone as the colour scheme is a sensible colour scheme however I think the writing in the black box may be harder to see from a distance so if I was going to use this design as my final design I would either have to change the colour

of the black boxes or the colour of the font to make it easier for the user to see the writing, I think this design meets the purpose of my product however the colour scheme does not really say

anything about the school and if I was going to use this design I would change some of the colours so they say something about the school because at the moment I don't think the colours say anything about the school.

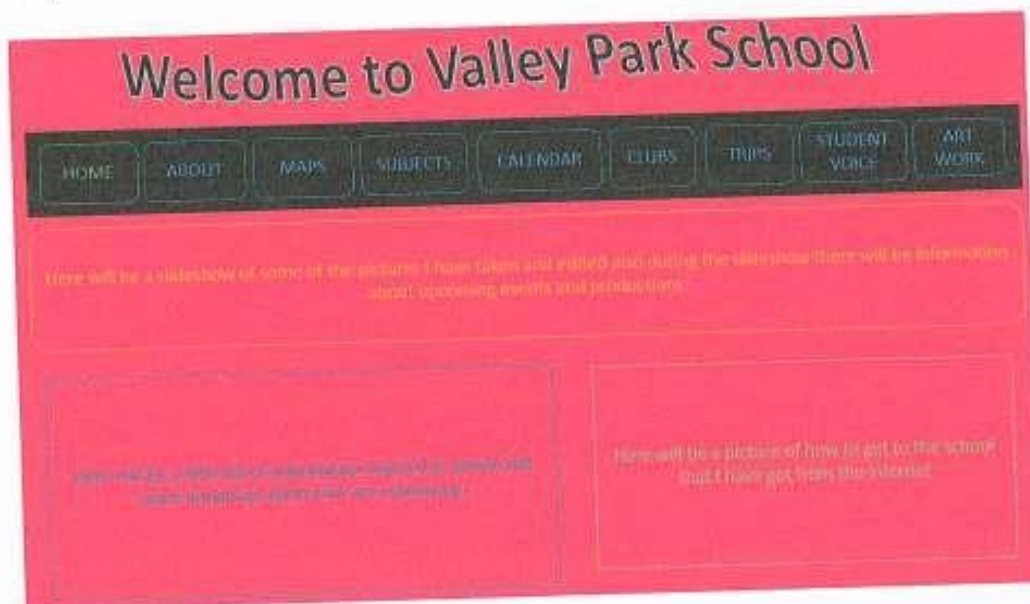

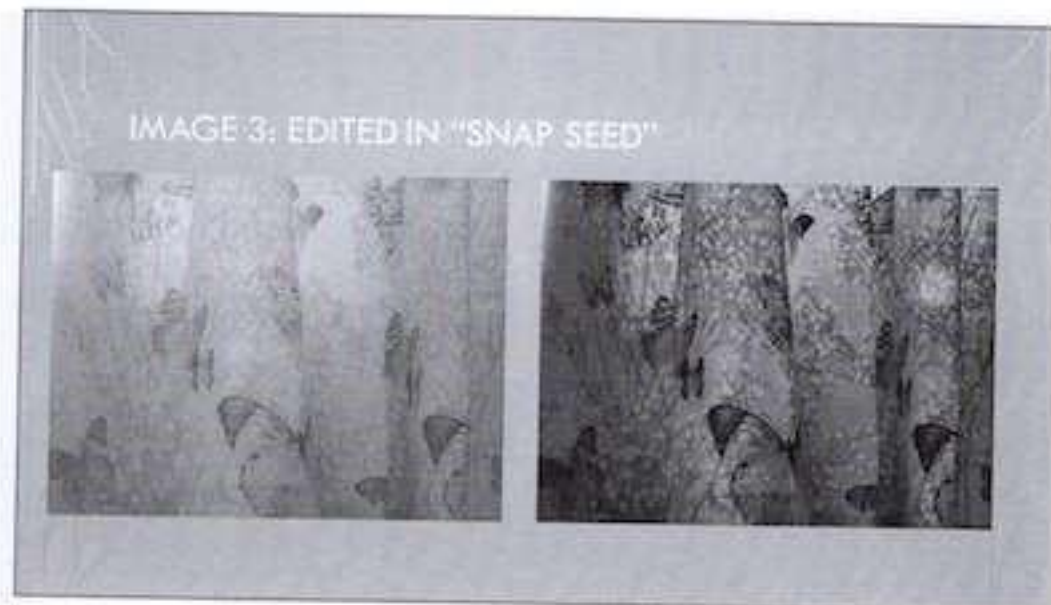
**Image Editing Software Experimentation**

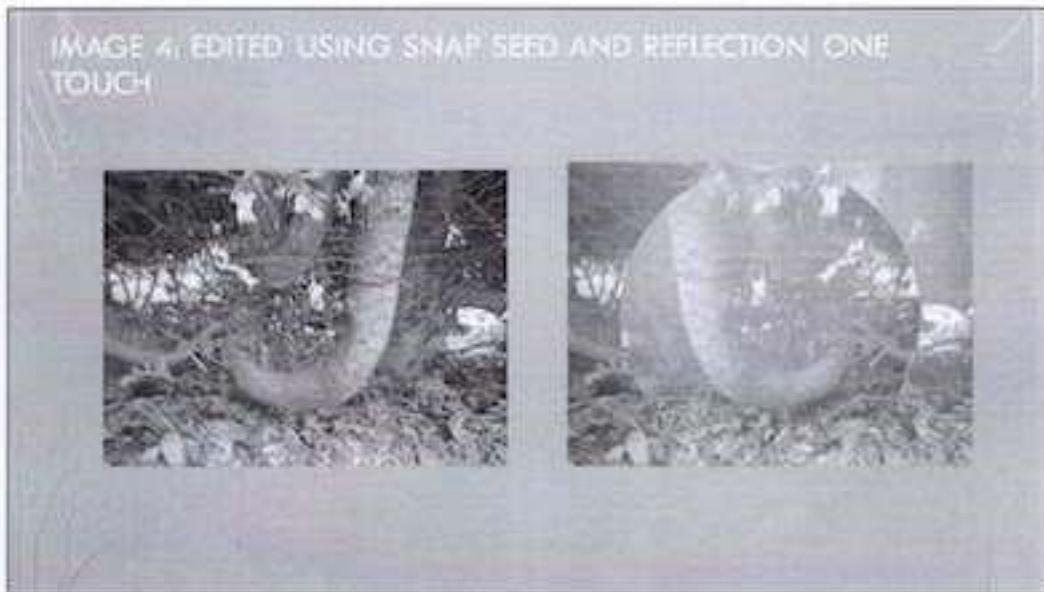
I find photoshop easy to use because I use the software in other subjects



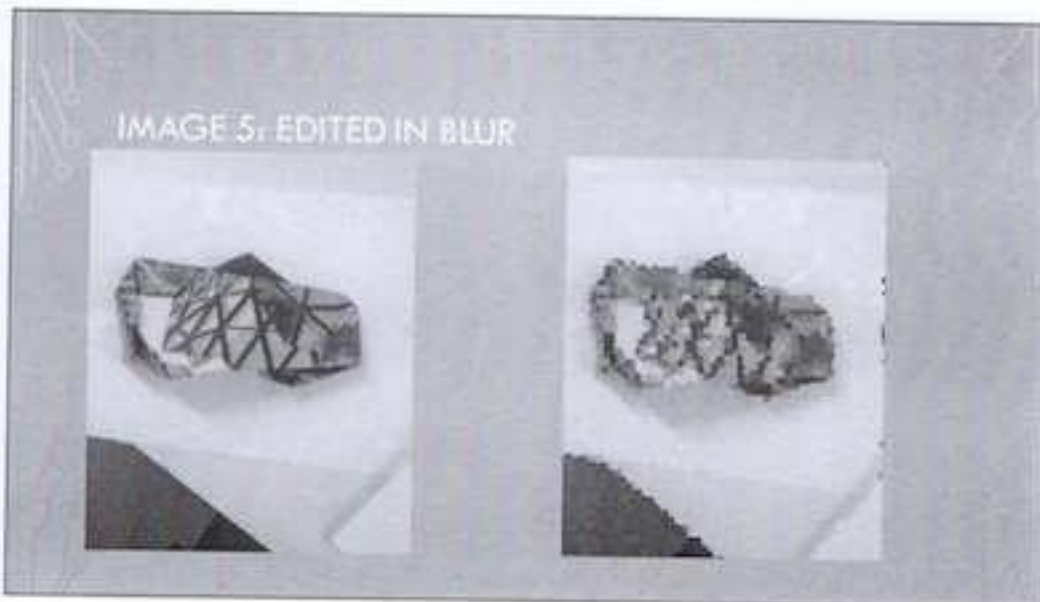
The image on the left is the original image and the image on the right is the edited image done in Photoshop by using the color balance tool and set it to +36 red, +10 green and +100 blue I have then used the levels tool to darken the image , I have also used the brightness and contrast tool to lighten the image and then I used the channel mixer tool at set the scales to -13% red, -17% green and +188% blue to make the final image. I found this easy to use because I use the software in other subjects frequently



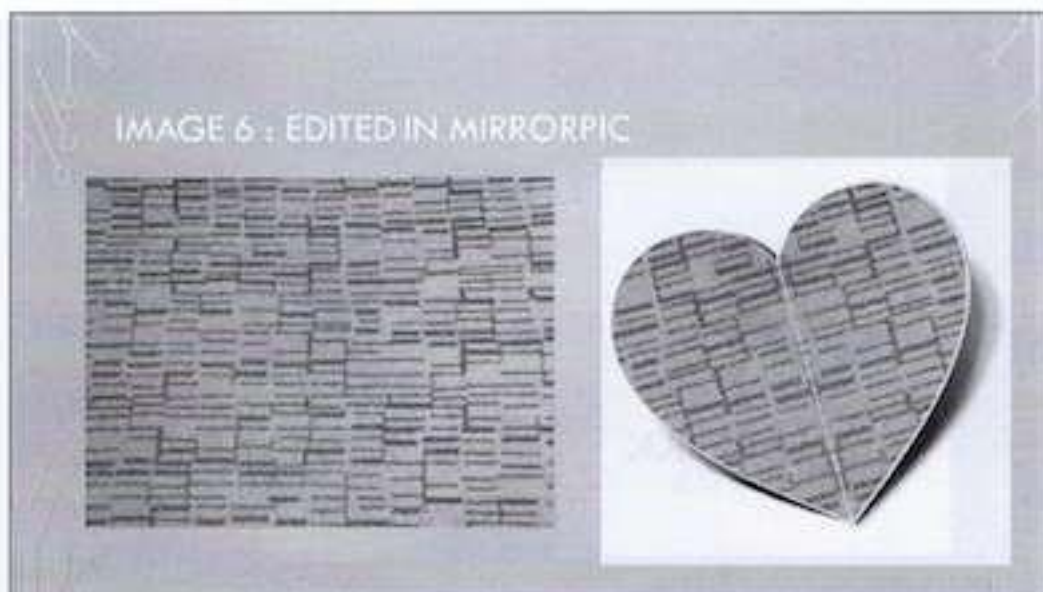
The image on the left is the original image and the image on the right is the edited image done on an app called snap seed. I have used the drama 2 filter on snap seed to darken the image. I found Snapseed easy to use because I use this regularly.



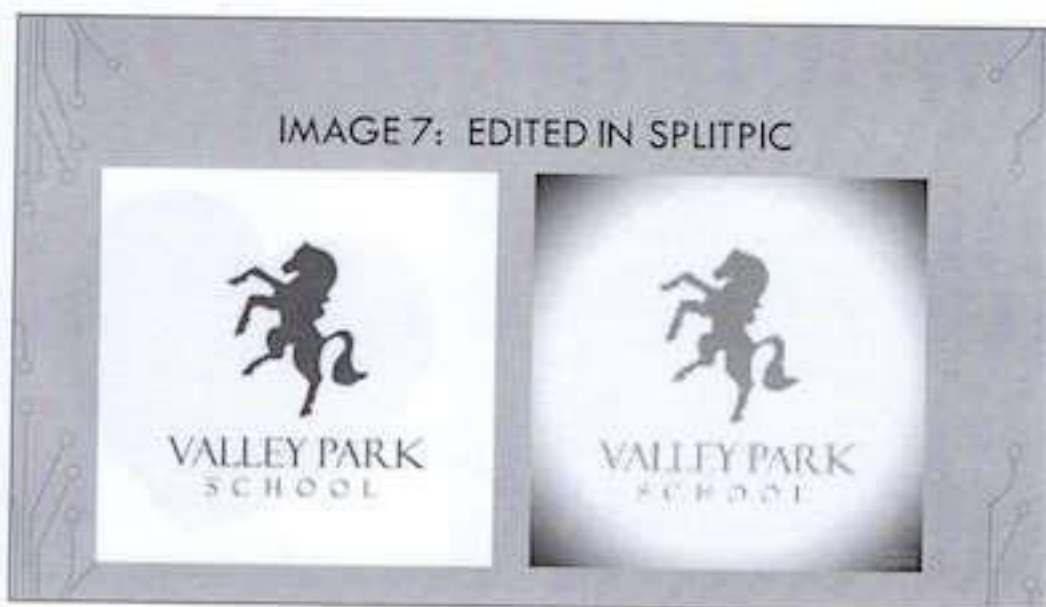
The image on the left hand side is the original image and the image on the right hand side is the edited image, I have used snap seed to flip the image and then I have used reflection one touch to put a red, blue, pink and purple filter and a circle filter. I found using both of these apps because I use the app in other subjects.



The image on the left hand side is the original image and the image on the right hand side is the edited image that I have done this in an app called blur, first I have blurred the image and then put a crystal filter over the top to give it that effect. 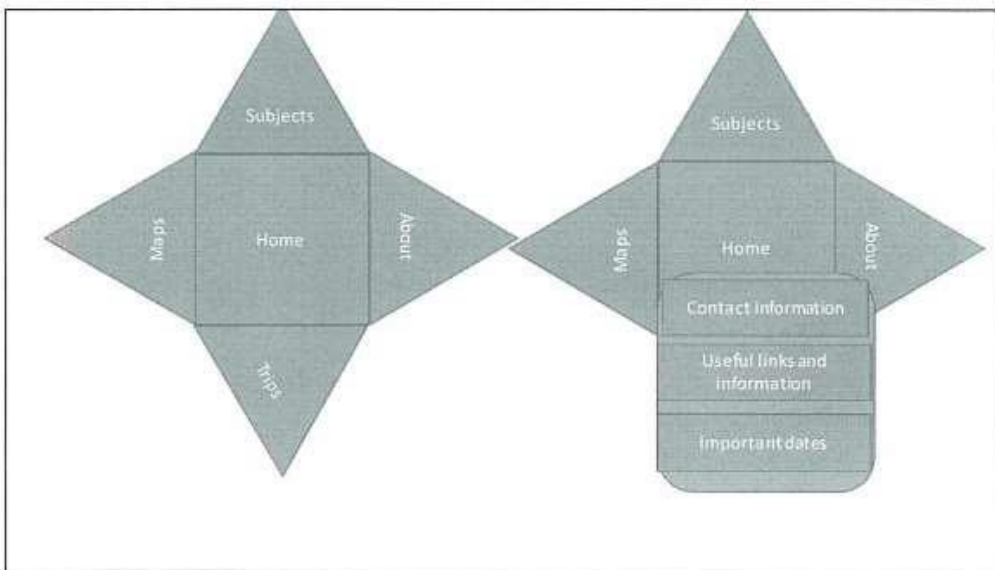

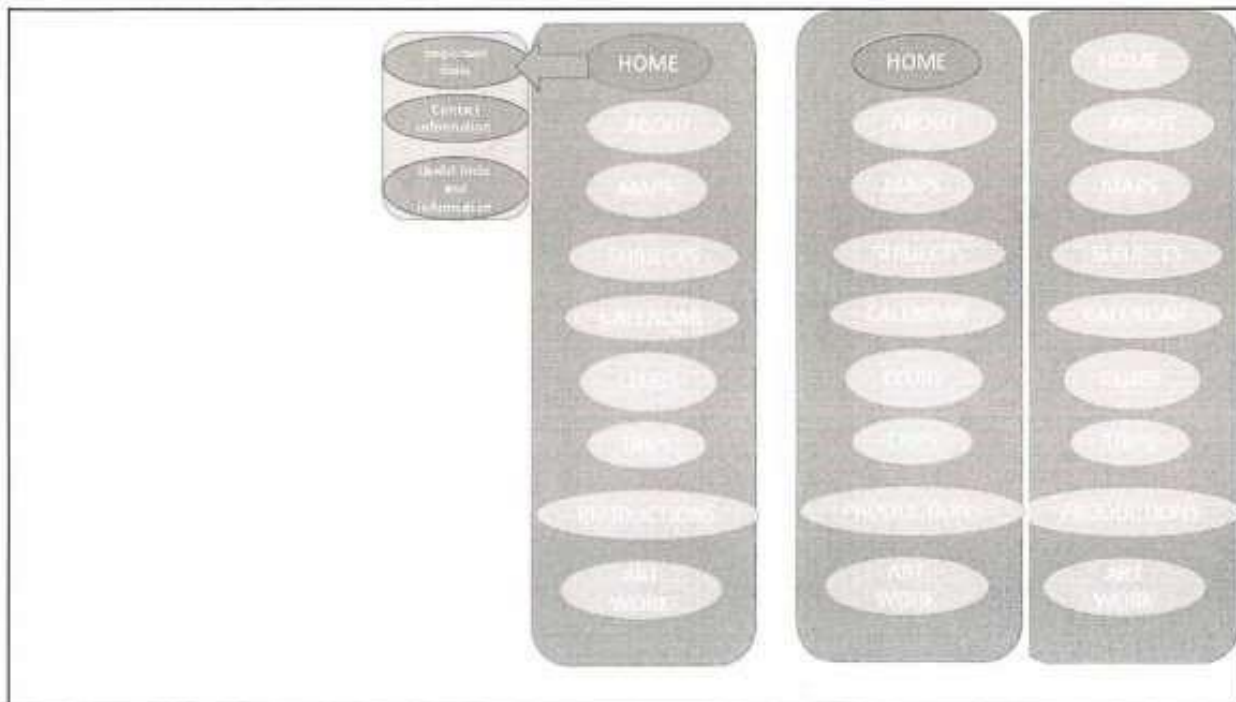

Font – I would use 'Agency FB' because I think it is really effective and very professional, different and unique.

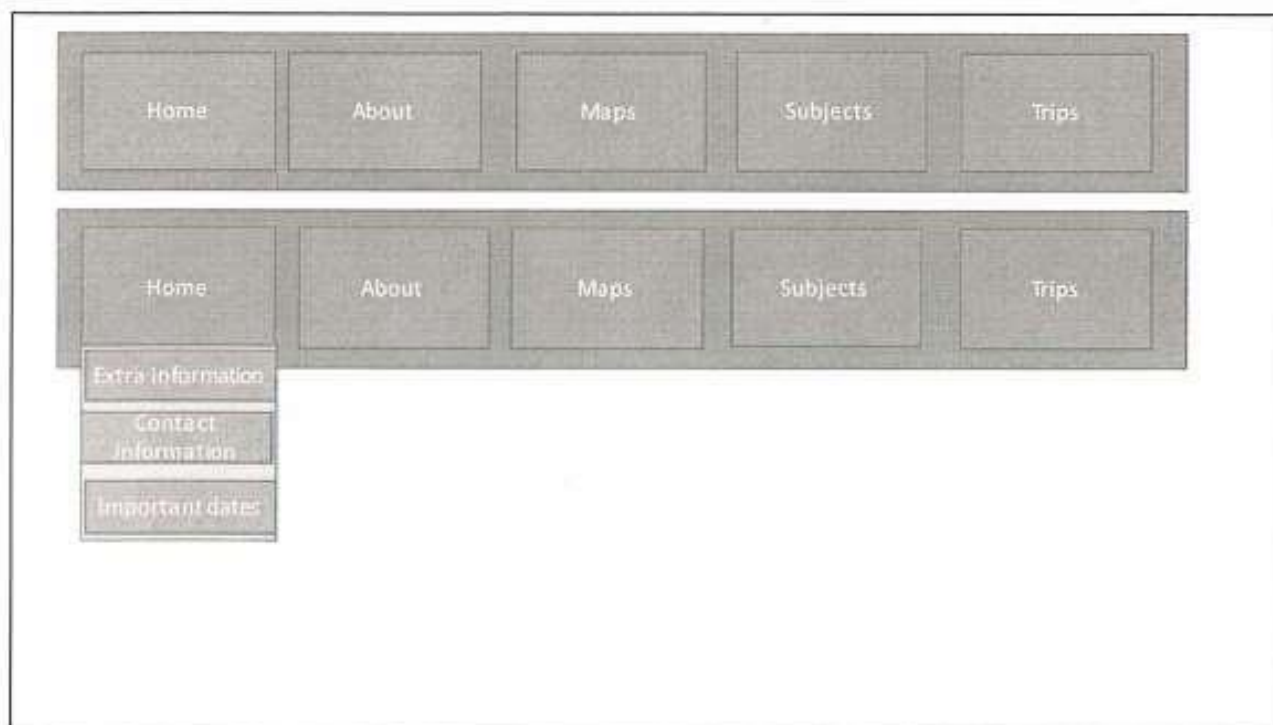
Colours – I have used blue and green as I think it is really effective and very different.

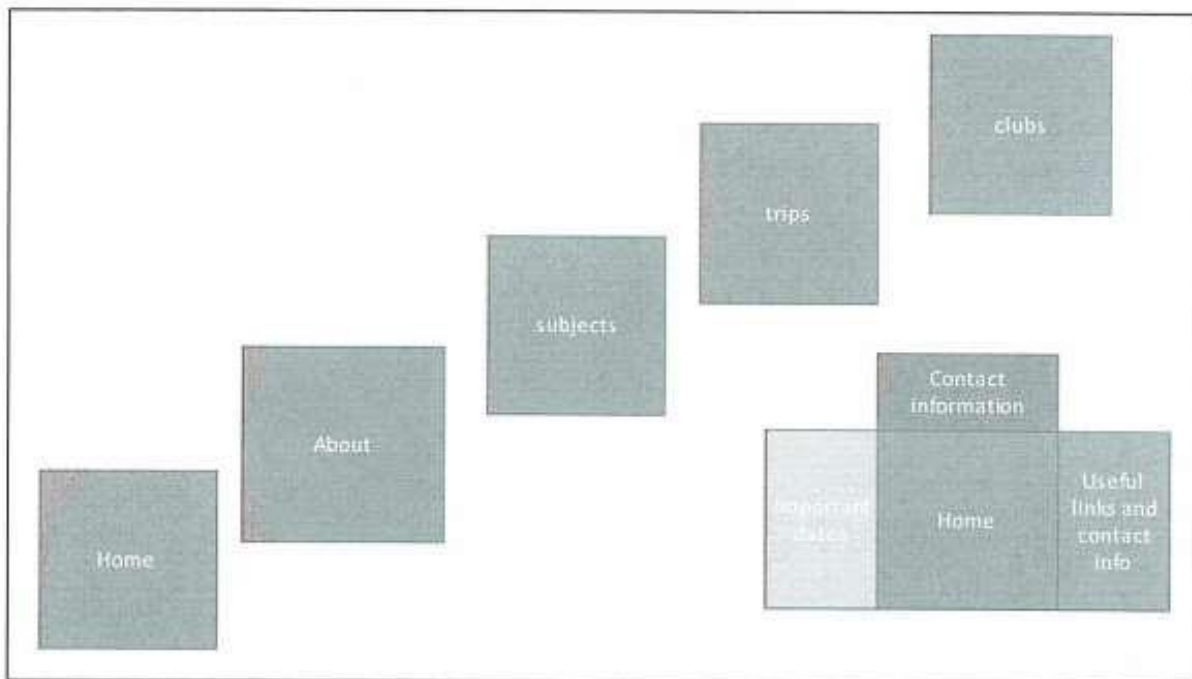

Interactivity - when the user clicks on one of the links little boxes will appear around the link in my opinion I think it is very unique and different.

Font - I would use 'Calibri' in a white font colour as I believe that it will make my product really professional and all my other designs have different fonts so I think this will make my product look really different and I think this will make my product different to other peoples.

Colours – the colours I have used are blue, white, red, yellow and green I think it is really effective and very interesting and different also I think it looks really unique and original.

## **Navigation Bar Experiments**

I will use Navigation bar 1 on every page because it is practical I can either use it on the left-hand side of the page or the right hand side. In my opinion I think I will use it on the right hand side of each page because I think it will look more professional therefore meeting the audience and purpose of my product.

I will use Navigation bar 2 on one page as the navigation bar goes right across the page meaning that it would be impractical to have this navigation bar on every page. I would not use this navigation bar because I feel that it is not as easy to navigate and I feel it would be more professional to have the Navigation Bar on every page which would also mean that there would be space on the document for more information therefore helping students and parents to find out information about Valley Park School.

I would use Navigation Bar 3 in the top right hand corner of every page I think this would look professional and I think it would meet the design brief, audience and purpose, however I think that if the navigation bar was in the corner then users may not notice the navigation bar making it



harder to navigate around my product therefore meaning I would not use this Navigation bar as it is not practical.

I would use Navigation bar 4 at the top of every page because it would look professional and it would be easy for the user to navigate around my product also I think the drop down menu is really clear and it will mean that users would be able to find the correct page to find the information that they needed. This design would meet the design brief, the audience and the purpose meaning it would be a suitable Navigation bar to use throughout my product.

## **Font Experimentation**

### **Example 1**

Font 1

This font is called 'Harrington', I like this font because I think this font is professional and easy to read I also like this design because I think it is different and will make my product stand out from the other fonts however I think this font may not be suitable because I think some of the letters are not as clear as other letters also if people may not be able to see what has been written clearly, I might use the Harrington font in my product because it is professional and I find it easy to read however I may not use this in my product because other people may find it hard to read and will not think it is clear enough.

### **Example 2**

Font 2

This font is called 'Agency FB', I like this font because I think it is professional and eye catching, I also like this design because I think it is unique however I don't think this font is suitable because from a distance some of the words and letters are not very clear. I may use this font in my product because I think it is professional and easy to read however I don't think I will be using this font in my product because I think it may not be very clear also some users may not be able to read the font easily and it may take the users focus off of the product as they are trying to read the writing.

### **Example 3**

Font 3

This font is called '*Lucida handwriting*', I like this font because I think it is clear and easy to read also I think It looks like I have handwritten the writing in my product however the font is quite big and to get it to a sensible size font I would have to put it at a size like 10 or lower but I would use this font in my product because I think it is really clear and easy to read also I think this design is really professional and unique, I think this will really make my product stand out and it might make the users want to read it.

**Example 5**

Font 5

This font is called 'freestyle script', I like this font because I think it is really professional and pretty however I think it is not clear also I think the users of my product would have trouble reading what my product is saying therefore my product would not be able to for fill its purpose. I will not use this font in my product because it is not clear and the user would struggle to read the writing in my product.

**Example 4**

Font 4

This font is called 'Microsoft Himalaya', I think this font is professional however when the font is at a size 12 it is very small and not very clear, I like this font because I think it is professional and very neat however for my product I do not think it is very clear and easy to read also if I went any bigger then I think it would look out of place in my product. No I do not think I will be using this font in my product because I think it will look out of place also I do not think may people will be able to read the writing therefore the product would not be able to for fill its purpose as no one would be able to read the writing easily.

**Font Styles Experimentation**

I would use font style 1 as the Navigation bar font in my product because I think that it is clear but I think it is more eye catching but some of the letters are difficult to read because they look quite similar to each other. I think this would suit the design brief because it looks really effective and it would be able to grab people's attention therefore for filling its purpose.

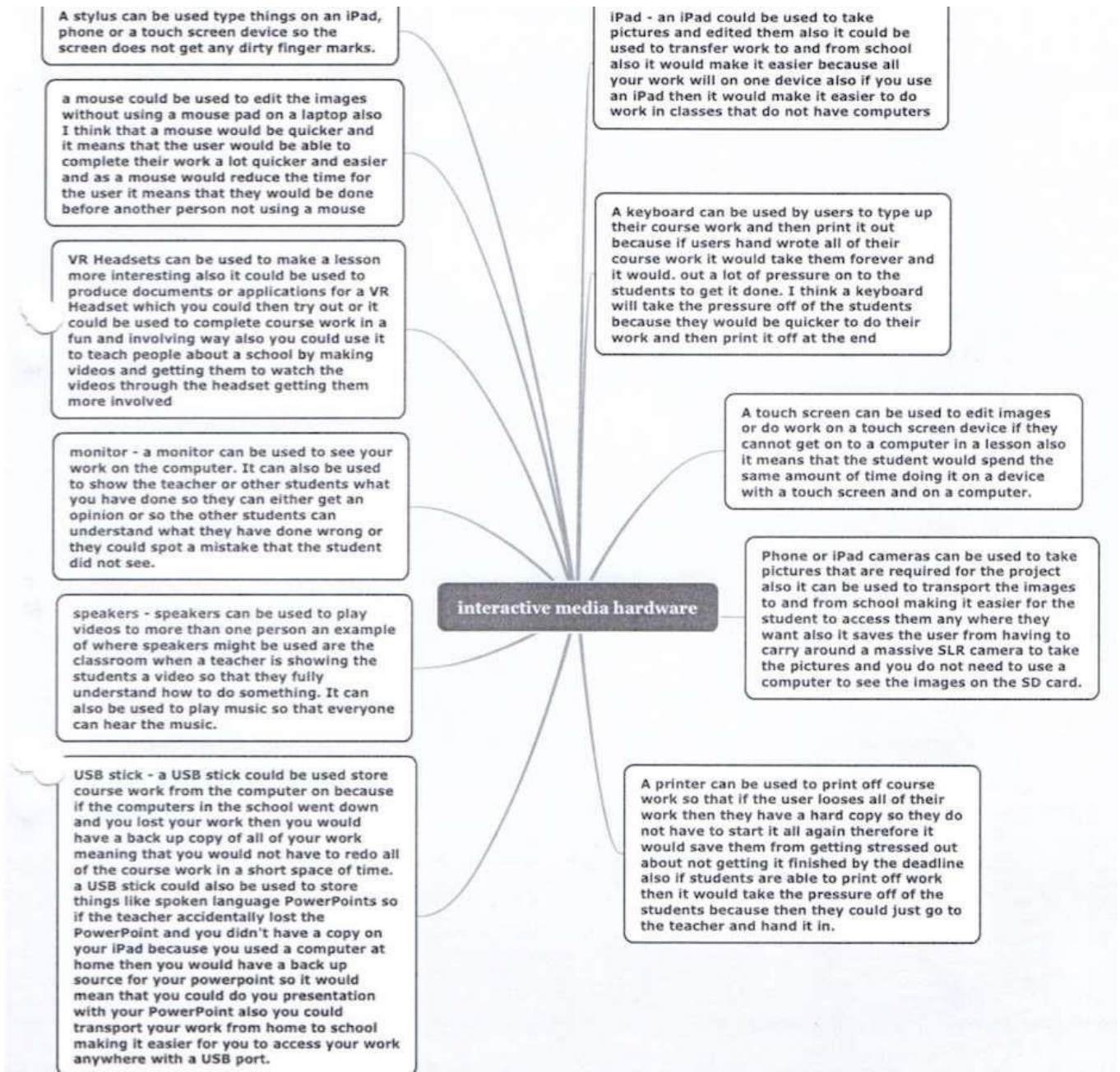
I would use font style 2 as the main text throughout my interactive media product because it is different and it will grab the attention of the user because it will be really effective and different therefore I think this font style would suit the design brief because it is professional, clear and easy to read meaning that it would for fill its purpose and it would look very unique in the product.

I would use font style 4 as maybe the main headings for each page because it is clear and very professional however, I think the font could be quite small on the screen if the font is not big enough then it would not look very effective also it would not be for filling its purpose because no one would be able to read it therefore no one would be able to for fill its purpose.

I would use font style 5 as the main body of writing because I think it looks really effective and professional but I think that this would not suit the audience and purpose because it is not a very clear font and I do not think the audience would be able to read all of the information.

**Hardware Experimentation**



**LO3: Review their experimentation with interactive media products Evaluation****Chosen navigation bar:**

I think the navigation bar experiments that I have done are different and I have shown the stages that the navigation bar has before it gets to the drop down menu, for example, in the first navigation bar experiment I have used a green rectangular box for the background of the navigation bar, I have also used yellow oval shapes for the buttons and over the top of the buttons there will be a dark colour over the buttons that the user has selected so the user knows which option they have selected also there will be a blue arrow to show which option the drop down menu and the background for the drop down menu it will be yellow and the oval shaped buttons will be green. I think this navigation bar will be really interactive as the buttons change colour also when the arrow for the drop-down menu appears the arrow will spin and grow at the same time as the drop-down menu is appearing. I think these navigation bar experiments were easy to create but then I found it hard to come up with different styles and designs that still met the design brief and the client requirements but after a lot of trial and error I came up with the selection I have made. There are a lot of positives with this section for example, I got to use many different tools in word that I would not have normally used meaning I have a better understanding of how to use more of the tools in word, also the navigation bar experiments have given a better understanding of the tasks also it has meant that I can figure out what colours are effective, eye catching, interactive and interesting. The negatives of this is section is I kept misplacing some of the documents because they did not save properly, which was really infuriating because it meant that I kept having to redo the documents. Next time, I would make sure all of my files are saved properly and are safe so that I don't have this problem. To improve my work, I would change some of the writing and put it into more detail, so I could explain the interactivity, font and colours better, so it would be clearer in case I had to print it out black and white.

**Chosen solutions:**

I feel that originally I had done well on my solutions PowerPoint but when I received my work back from the teacher I realised that my work was not in enough detail and I needed to find the original document and add these corrections, however when I tried to find the document I realised that I put it on to OneNote and didn't save it onto my computer meaning when OneNote crashed I had lost their work meaning I had to redo the PowerPoint, I found that recreating my work took quite a long time and I found it quite difficult to find the right facts and information that I needed for the different sections in my PowerPoint, but I did find that it made me think more about the document and the information which made me think about how I was going to word it so that it made sense to me when I came to read the information and write about it in a review. One thing I can take away from this section is that I have a much better understanding of the tasks and the level of detail that the documents need to be completed in also I now know that I have to save everything that I produce and I have to make sure it is saved properly even if I put it on OneNote or send it to the teacher for marking.

**Chosen Colour Schemes:**

I think the colour scheme designs went well when creating them I used tools in PowerPoint that I had not used before which enabled me to learn how to do new things like put an image in the background like the first the design. I think the first design is effective and different to all of the other designs because for the background there is an image of the school reception in the background however, I think the title does not stand out against the background meaning that it

would not be easy to see also I think the information boxes and the navigation bar blocks out the image so new students, visitors and parents might not be able to tell what the image is because the school logo is not clear and I feel that it does not promote the school as the image is not clear therefore this would not be a good design to use. I think the fourth design is more aimed at girls than boys as it is pink, which is not a colour that I think, would appeal to both genders and I think where the colours are quite dark, the writing does not stand out very well against the colours because they are also quite dark, so it blends in rather than stand out.

There are lots of positives to this section for example, it has enabled me to learn about new tools and things I could use them for to create interesting things, also it has given me an insight into what colours go well together and what colours that do not go well together. Next time, I could pick out a colour scheme that I would use in my product and explain why; I think this would have helped me when creating my product.

### **Chosen font styles:**

I think I done my font styles in detail and I used fonts that were clear and some that were not so I could see which fonts would be the most effective to use in my product the positive things about this section was It meant that I had to think about what would look good and whether it was suitable for the product and the audience's wants and needs for example, one of the fonts I used was professional but not clear to read as it was slanted and some of the letters had been made to look like other letters which means that user will not be able to view the writing very well, when creating my chosen font styles, I found it quite difficult to pick out fonts that looked effective and ones that were easy to read also it was not easy to find ones that were difficult to read so that I could show why I would not use the specific fonts, to improve my work I will make sure that I spend less time trying to find specific fonts and more time doing the writing and making sure it definitely made complete sense also to make it easier for me, I will make sure that I have saved all of my work properly so if I accidentally misplace the paper copy I could just reprint the document and have no problems.

### **Chosen Image Editing Software:**

The positive things about my image editing software experiments was it meant that I got to learn new skills and use the skills that I already know to create my edited images that I might use in my interactive media product, also I think I could have used more sophisticated language to explain what I have done but I think I have described how I have used the software and the tools to make the images look different and effective to engage the audience quite well. During this experience I have developed an understanding of the kind of things that I need to produce for clients also I have developed a wider range of skills on certain pieces of software like Photoshop, Fireworks and Snapseed. The negative things about this section is I do not think that I done the write up in enough detail because I spent too much time on the editing of the images and not enough time on the write up so next time to improve my work I will make sure I half the time that I have to make sure I can write about my work and make sure everything made sense so it made sense to me and how I created the image just in case I have to recreate the image later in my life.

### **Chosen Hardware:**

In this section I had research about different types of hardware like computers and keyboards and then create a mind map about the information that I found and how people could use them to help them with their daily schedules and promoting themselves, the positives of this section meant that I could figure out ways of making my life easier also it meant that I could explore each option in detail therefore developing a better understanding of the task and options I wrote about, however

the negatives of this section were it took a while to find out the information that I needed to help me out when creating the document on my iPad. Next time I would not do as many of the options but then I would go into a more detail about the few selected options therefore meaning I would have more time to look into each of them better.

## **Unit 2 – Plan and prepare for an interactive media product LO1: Understand how to produce a proposal to meet a brief**

### **Audience and Purpose**

#### **Audience:**

The target audience for this interactive media product is mainly New Year 7s of all genders and the shared interest of wanting to use this product to help them learn more about their new school. Additionally, it will also need to cater to any visitors, parents, new six formers, or any other student new or old and inform them of anything they may not already know. I will use a clear simple font so that everyone can read it, and the font size won't have to be that big, I won't need to use big buttons or images or bright colours as these are features commonly found in products aimed at small children and as the youngest people using it will most likely be year 7s (ages 11-12) I will not need to use these features and if I did it might drive them away as it feels to childish to use something none of my audience would appreciate. If I follow these basic I will be able to make my product appeal to such a wide range of ages, both genders and the common interest of finding out more about the school.

#### **Purpose:**

The purpose of this interactive media product is to inform students about the school and help new students find their way around it, for example; showing them where each class is and how to get there from the kiosk, giving them a list of the teachers and what they teach and the class rooms they normally use; and what clubs are available on different days, what you do at the club, who its run by and where it is; etc. This would help my audience as it informs everybody about the school which is something my product needs to do as well as helping to teach the new students about the school. My product will do this by using a map of the school and highlighting the class room the student wanted to find along with an arrow detailing the quickest route, this help the students to find their way around the school, and to make sure that the kiosk also informs the students about the school my product will have multiple pages detailing about clubs, subjects, teachers and a frequently asked question page where the student can find the answers to and ask their own questions they have might have about the school.

### **Client Requirements**

To meet the design brief we would add an interactive kiosk. We would need to take into consideration the audience of the product. It would need to appeal to year 7s mainly but also the students at GCSE level and at sixth form this is, so the students know where their next class is and what activities they could partake in after school. Its purpose would be to inform the students of where classrooms are and the lessons that take place within them and a list of clubs they could partake in. I will do this by having the kiosk ask the person what classroom/ lesson they have next or what club/ GCSE options they want to find out about, after having this data inputted the kiosk would use its real time intelligence to show the person a detailed map of the school and what route they can take to get there or if they have inputted a class name it would show the person all the rooms that have teach those classes and the teacher(s) that use them. If they wanted to learn about classes/ options and clubs it would bring up a screen with all the available options, teachers and rooms that correspond with them. This will be touchscreen.

From looking at the design brief I have been able to pick out 11 features that must be included in the final product. The most important thing to include in the final product is the map of the school. Other important quality's the client has requested is how it should supply details about that extra curriculum clubs, include the wide range of GCSE and 6th form subjects, be easy to maintain, be a



sensible style, be unique and outstanding, be professional and fit for purpose, have a new logo designed for it, supply school details, be used by any year group and finally it must be interactive.

### **Design**

The product needs to be unique, outstanding and professional. It needs to have a sensible style and be in the school's colours. It will also need to have the new logo for the school in the product, well will need to make this new logo ourselves.

The design and layout of the product will need to appeal to meet these requirements, and this can be achieved by using a high quality, consistent and easily understandable house style throughout my product. This makes my product look and feel professional and of an outstanding quality, I will make it feel unique by using fonts and layouts that while still look professional and are in keeping with the brief, are not the normal fonts and layouts used by valley park normally on documents and on their website. This house style will also need to be sensible, use school colours and appeal to the target audience; new students coming to the school and visitors, this will all be achieved with a font that is plain and simple so that everyone can read it easily and the school colours will be heavily included within the house style which is sensible because it incorporates features and aspects that the audience will appreciate and that will help it to better serve its purpose. This will all help the user easily associate my product with the school and its intended purpose, all while in keeping with what my client wants. The new logo will need to be designed with all this in mind. It will need to be; sensible by incorporating aspects that will meet the audience and purpose, professional and outstanding by making the best use of the software that I use to make it to make the final logo slick and with a clear connection back to the school, mainly through the use of the schools colours, and unique as it will be a complete redesign of the logo to one which I feel will better suit the product and the school by looking extensively as to what the school represents and stands for and what it wants to show off through this product.

### **Function**

The product needs to be easy to maintain, have interactive elements and easy to use for all years and people of all ability.

The function of the product will need to be easy to pick up and use due to the expansive nature of the audience for the product. The product is intended for new students and visitors of the school, more specifically new year 7s and although technologies widespread and almost universal nature, the way that my product will need to be operated by the user needs to still be very simplistic and easy to follow as everyone's understanding of technology is different and this way everyone of all ages and abilities will be able to understand and utilise the product to its fullest. This can be achieved through a simple and clearly labelled navigation bar and through clear buttons and prompts on each slide. The product is also required to have interactive elements, this can easily be achieved through the use of different functions and tools that the software I use to create the product gives me. I will be sure to include features like sound, images, videos, and animations but also more complex and engaging features such as roll overs, sound effects, external links, and a quiz for the user to partake in. These elements all help to make the product more appealing, interesting and engaging for the user, promoting its use and appeal to the audience so that it can perform its purpose. I will make the products software easy to maintain through the use of easy to use software to create and maintain it, this means it can be picked up easily by the person in charge of managing it and it will make repairs, updates and minor bug fixes much easier to perform allowing for these to be implemented frequently allowing for a better user experience, leading to a higher user satisfaction rate meaning the product has served its purpose well.

### **Content**

The product will need to contain the school's details (location, contact information, uniform list, etc.), useful information for the user (club list, subject lists, calendar, canteen menu, etc.) and a fully interactive map to help guide the new year 7s around the school.

I will be sure to include pages dedicated to giving the users the information they require, by ensuring these pages are clearly labelled on the navigation bar and all have easy to spot links to the pages through the use of rollovers and clearly defined buttons in a clear and easy to read font. This allows the product to meet its purpose of supplying the target audience of new students and visitors will helpful information about the school, what it stands for and any extra information the student needs or wants to learn about the school. The home page will include a map of the school and the local area to help with new students better understand with where the school is and what can be found in the local area, it will also have a list of the schools contact details (phone, fax, email, address, student support emails) that I will be able to source form the valley park site, this can allow any new students or any visitors/parents who maybe have any queries or concerns about the school to know where to contact in order to raise these and hopefully receive an answer for these. Finally I will have a whole page dedicated to including a map of the school, which will be made interactive by having a clearly labelled and easy to use navigation bar with it that will highlight the area of the school that the user hovers over and when clicked will take them to a separate page with the option to view a close up of that building, the inside, the next building on the navigation bar or to return to the map of the whole school. All these interactive elements help to keep the user invested and they encourage the user to use the product again and to locate any more information that they may want.

### **Exploration of Videos**

An interactive video is a video that a user can interact with. These types of videos play like normal ones but have areas on the video that the user can click on and this then takes them to another part of the video or a different website entirely. Below are 5 examples of interactive video and a website on which they are normally found, this to help me decide whether or not to use a video n my final product and why.

The designer of this page has decided to use the video in this way because this way you are forced to watch at least 5 seconds of the add before the video you wanted to play can be played, this keeps your focus for long enough for you to learn the name of the company and a brief idea of what they do, and sometimes this is enough to keep you watching the whole ad and potentially get you to click on one of the many links plastered on the video to get you to go to their website.

The designer of this page has decided to use the video in this way because the channel wanted to find out what a former colony would look like in today's numbers and to share this curiosity with the rest of YouTube, also he might have included a collaboration with another you tuber to boost his own channel or boost his channel as a kind act or just because he needed help on his video and gave the other channel a shout out as thanks.

The designer of this page has decided to use the video in this way because it is eye-catching, and your attention is drawn right away to the first video and then the bright blue links surrounding it encouraging you to look at the other pages on the site and to watch more videos about the aspect of teaching that you need to know more about.

The designer of this page has decided to use the video in this way because a lot of people use the BBC website and having an educational video on a very serious topic that people need to be informed on, this is helpful as this large audience will see this video, a watch it and be informed.

### **Quality and Compression of Images Image types**

A vector graphic is a drawing or visual created through connecting a series of lines and curves to create the shapes found in a vector graphic. This allows for the graphic to be any size without sacrificing the images quality. The files are often small in size and common formats include: .svg, .cgm, .odg, .eps, .xml. <https://vectr.com/tutorials/what-are-vector-graphics/>

A bitmap graphic is an image that is made up from a series of small squares of a single colour called a pixel, most images are bitmap and the higher the resolution of the image the more pixels it has, meaning the image looks clearer and can hold more detail, but the image quality is lost when the size is altered. Common file formats are: .jpg, .gif, .png, .exif, .tiff

A video image is a sequence of images that, when played in quick succession, form a moving picture, and often have an audio component included that when played alongside it, the audio will correspond with the images being shown, creating a video. Common file formats for these include: .avi, .mov, .mp4, .mkv, .flv

### **Image components**

A pixel or, picture element, is the smallest part of an image. It is a tiny square comprised of only one colour and is joined together with multiple other pixels to form one larger image, video, text or anything visible on the screen of the computer.

The image resolution is the number of pixels that make up an image. It is often identified by multiplying the number of pixels wide an image is by the number of pixels high an image is. The more pixels in an image, the higher the resolution meaning the image will be clearer and contain more detail, however the higher the resolution the more storage space it takes up as there is more of it to store.

The relationship between the resolution and on-screen appearance is the higher the resolution the better quality the on-screen appearance it, the items being displayed will be sharper and clearer. However, a high resolution on a computer can make elements such as icons and text appear smaller, and in terms of an image's appearance on screen- although a high resolution will increase the images quality, it will take up more space to store.

The image quality is a way of describing an image that compares the images degradation (lack of quality) when compared to a model or optimal image. The factors that can affect an images quality are things like; the brightness, contrast, resolution, the clearness of the colours, tones and the overall lighting of the image. Most of the time the image quality is improved through the use of editing software such as Photoshop on the computer.

A file format is the organisation of files in regard to what data is stored within the file. The program that uses the data within the file uses the files format in order to recognise, access and process the data in the file. The file format is usually shown through the file extension on the end of a files name. A few examples of file formats would be; .doc for word, .htm or .html for web pages, and .exe for executable programs.

### **Image compression**


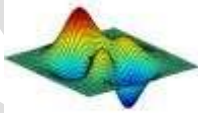
Image compression is when an image file is encoded or converted so that it takes up less space than it originally did, this is usually done so that files can be stored easier or so that it doesn't take up as much space when it is sent or received. This is normally done through an image compression algorithm.


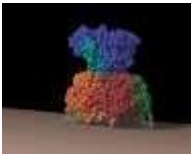



Lossy compression is when data is permanently lost during the compression. They are able to create very small file sizes and there is lots of hardware to support it however the original image degrades significantly and there is no way to get it back after compressing. Examples include .jpge and .gif. Lossless compression is when the file size is compressed down, but the image quality is





not lost and can be recovered. They provide a slight decrease in file size and there is no loss in quality, however they create larger files than the file that would be created from using lossy. Examples include .png and .bmp.

The main difference between them is the fact that data can be recovered in lossless but is permanently lost in lossy, in addition to the quality being reduced in lossy but remaining the same in lossless. This would initially make lossless preferable to lossy however lossy will help to significantly reduce the files size when compared to lossless so if a smaller file is desired then lossy would be preferable to lossless.

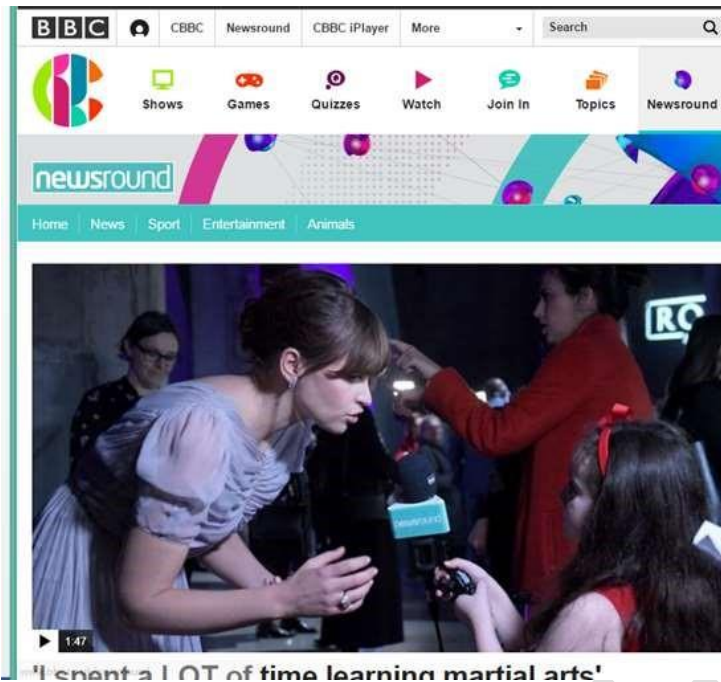
The effect that compression has on image quality is that the image quality will be reduced through lossy compression, as data that will make the image clearer and more defined is lost permanently meaning the image will have degraded and will continue to degrade every time it is compressed producing an end result of a much smaller file but a significant decrease in file size. Lossless will keep the image quality the same as this type of compression only removes unnecessary metadata from the file and that data can be recovered if needs be meaning while the file size fluctuates, the image will remain mostly untouched- the quality of the image preserved.

## Website Reviews



The audience is older children and some teenagers 10-13 and it is for both genders, because it has no main colour theme and it has no specified age or gender. The purpose is to inform kids of the news and about what is happening about the world, because it is based on the news "Newsround" and it is produced by CBBC children's British broadcasting company.

It is easy to navigate the site because they have a balance of pictures and text to attract the people's eye but not treat them like kids with only pictures, because it is for children, so it has to be easy to navigate. The layout of the site is colourful and eye catching. The site catches my attention because it is colourful and well laid out, because it needs to look colourful to attract children to the site.

The use of colour makes a good contrast between light and dark colour, because it needs to look colourful to attract children to the site. It has a good balance between text and pictures they need this because their audience are young adults and they expect to be treated like young adults. It has buttons that you can press to get on to games, news, quizzes and to watch. These make the website easy to use because it lets you navigate it without worries or problems. The text is bold, and it stands out. It doesn't blend in to the background therefore it is good text and it is relevant to the links, because they need people to see it and use it. I will not use the main theme pictures because our audience and purpose are New Year 7's and our purpose are to help them navigate the school.





The audience of this website is smaller children of all genders this is evident because of the bright colours and big icons with big pictures. The purpose of the website is for younger audiences to play games which relate to their favourite television show and for both parents and children to find out more about the shows that they are watching.

The navigation is easy to follow so each hyperlink is large and bright, so they are easy to click and have large images on them, so you don't necessarily need to be able to read to navigate this site, because this would be ideal if you are a small child who is at pre-school or younger who doesn't know how to navigate a computer just yet. The layout of this website is good because it puts all the more recent and latest games/quizzes on the front page in large boxes so the child does not have to look for the latest activities which the website has, then at the top (still in relatively large icons) it has all the older activities that the child can explore and enjoy.

This website immediately grabs your attention, especially if you are younger, this is because all of the bright colours that are used and how much of them they have used, this clash of strong colours really grabs your attention and makes it hard to look away. They have used mainly purple and yellow as their main colour scheme, which blends well, but they have also used lots of other colours on the icons that clash with the yellow and purple to make certain aspects of the website stand out more to make it easier for younger audiences to distinguish the buttons this would be helpful because the age group that the website is aimed at would not be able to read very well and having bright and obvious buttons to click on would help them to find what activity they want.

They have not added that much text because the younger audience would not be able to read that well and would require pictures to show them what the page is about, which is why they have included so many pictures, they have also included lots of games and other activities for the audience to partake in because most small children probably would be more interested in playing games and watching videos than reading articles.

The website uses hyperlinks (so the child can choose where to go), interactive games about popular shows (which the user can partake in), quizzes about shows and various other topics (which they can partake in), and go on interactive tours of some of the sets of their favourite shows, this makes the website better because the children would really enjoy the sense of being in control and exploring the website at their own pace and being able to choose what they want to do.

The target audience for this interactive media product is mainly New Year 7s of all genders and the shared interest of wanting to use this product to help them learn more about their new school. Additionally, it will also need to cater to any visitors, parents, new six formers, or any other student new or old and inform them of anything they may not already know. I will use a clear simple font so that everyone can read it, and the font size won't have to be that big, I won't need to use big buttons or images or bright colours as these are features commonly found in products aimed at small children and as the youngest people using it will most likely be year 7s (ages 11-12) I will not need to use these features and if I did it might drive them away as it feels to childish to use something none of my audience would appreciate. If I follow these basic I will be able to make my product appeal to such a wide range of ages, both genders and the common interest of finding out more about the school.

**Purpose:**

The purpose of this interactive media product is to inform students about the school and help new students find their way around it, for example; showing them where each class is and how to get there from the kiosk, giving them a list of the teachers and what they teach and the class rooms they normally use; and what clubs are available on different days, what you do at the club, who its run by and where it is; etc. This would help my audience as it informs everybody about the school which is something my product needs to do as well as helping to teach the new students about the school. My product will do this by using a map of the school and highlighting the class room the student wanted to find along with an arrow detailing the quickest route, this help the students to find their way around the school, and to make sure that the kiosk also informs the students about the school my product will have multiple pages detailing about clubs, subjects, teachers and a frequently asked question page where the student can find the answers to and ask their own questions they have might have about the school.

**Presenter and Background**

Within my product I have chosen to use a cartoonish style to make the product upbeat and happy. I am going to use colours that reflect the school well, such as green and gold. I have chosen these colours because they are going to show off the school and will be instantly recognizable by anyone who uses it, as they are the school colours. I have chosen to make my professional because I think it needs to look profession when visitors and new students use it to make a good impression on them. I will be keeping the school logo and other key areas such as the introduction to the school and the navigation bar one every single page. This is to make the product look more professional and also to make it easier to use. With the navigation bar on each page people will be able to use the product and will know how to get from page to another.

**Platform**

The final product that I am creating will be an interactive kiosk because I feel that this is best suited to the desired audience and purpose. This is because an interactive kiosk could be placed in a range of locations around the school and students would be able to access them. I would suggest that these products are placed in the canteen, library, reception and the hall for best access to them. These are places where lots of students will be passing through and therefore anyone who is

lost or who doesn't know where they are going can access one of these kiosks. I have also chosen a kiosk as they will be able to inform students as they are moving around, compared to using a website as some students will not have their iPads or access to a mobile device in order to view their website. I have chosen to use Mediator to create my final product because I already know how to use the software and it can create interactive media products with ease. It is also installed on the school's computers and will be something that our students would be able to use and install easily. It also allows me to create an .exe file that can be run on the school's computers and the devices that will be used as part of this information kiosk.

### **Content**

The product will need to contain the school's details (location, contact information, uniform list, etc.), useful information for the user (club list, subject lists, calendar, canteen menu, etc.) and a fully interactive map to help guide the new year 7s around the school.

I will be sure to include pages dedicated to giving the users the information they require, by ensuring these pages are clearly labelled on the navigation bar and all have easy to spot links to the pages through the use of rollovers and clearly defined buttons in a clear and easy to read font. This allows the product to meet its purpose of supplying the target audience of new students and visitors will helpful information about the school, what it stands for and any extra information the student needs or wants to learn about the school. The home page will include a map of the school and the local area to help with new students better understand with where the school is and what can be found in the local area, it will also have a list of the schools contact details (phone, fax, email, address, student support emails) that I will be able to source form the valley park site, this can allow any new students or any visitors/parents who maybe have any queries or concerns about the school to know where to contact in order to raise these and hopefully receive an answer for these. Finally I will have a whole page dedicated to including a map of the school, which will be made interactive by having a clearly labelled and easy to use navigation bar with it that will highlight the area of the school that the user hovers over and when clicked will take them to a separate page with the option to view a close up of that building, the inside, the next building on the navigation bar or to return to the map of the whole school. All these interactive elements help to keep the user invested and they encourage the user to use the product again and to locate any more information that they may want.

## **Techniques**

### **Sound editing**

Sound editing is where you edit the sound in a video or add in background music or sound effects into your interactive media product, this helps to improve the quality of the video by adjusting the volume, pitch and editing out any unnecessary background noise, background music and sound effects help to improve the emersion of a product, encouraging the user to keep using the product and it make the product more pleasant to use. The sound editing will be implemented into the software that I have chosen to use to create my final product.

### **Image manipulation**

Image manipulation is where you edit an image in order to make it look nicer, link in better with the product or use the editing software to give the image the desired tone to match the rest of the product, this helps to improve the product by adjusting brightness and darkness of the image to

make it look nicer or clearer, or edit out any parts of the image that shouldn't be there or add in any parts that should be there, the edited images can also be used in a video or to accompany a video. The image manipulation will be implemented into the software that I have chosen to use to create my final product.

### **Interactive media authorising software**

Interactive media authorising software is the software used to collate everything- so the images, sound, videos, animation, information, etc. –and imputed them all into one software. This is used to create a product for clients and customers to use and view, so that they can learn more about your company/organisation and what it does. I will need this in order to create an interactive media product.

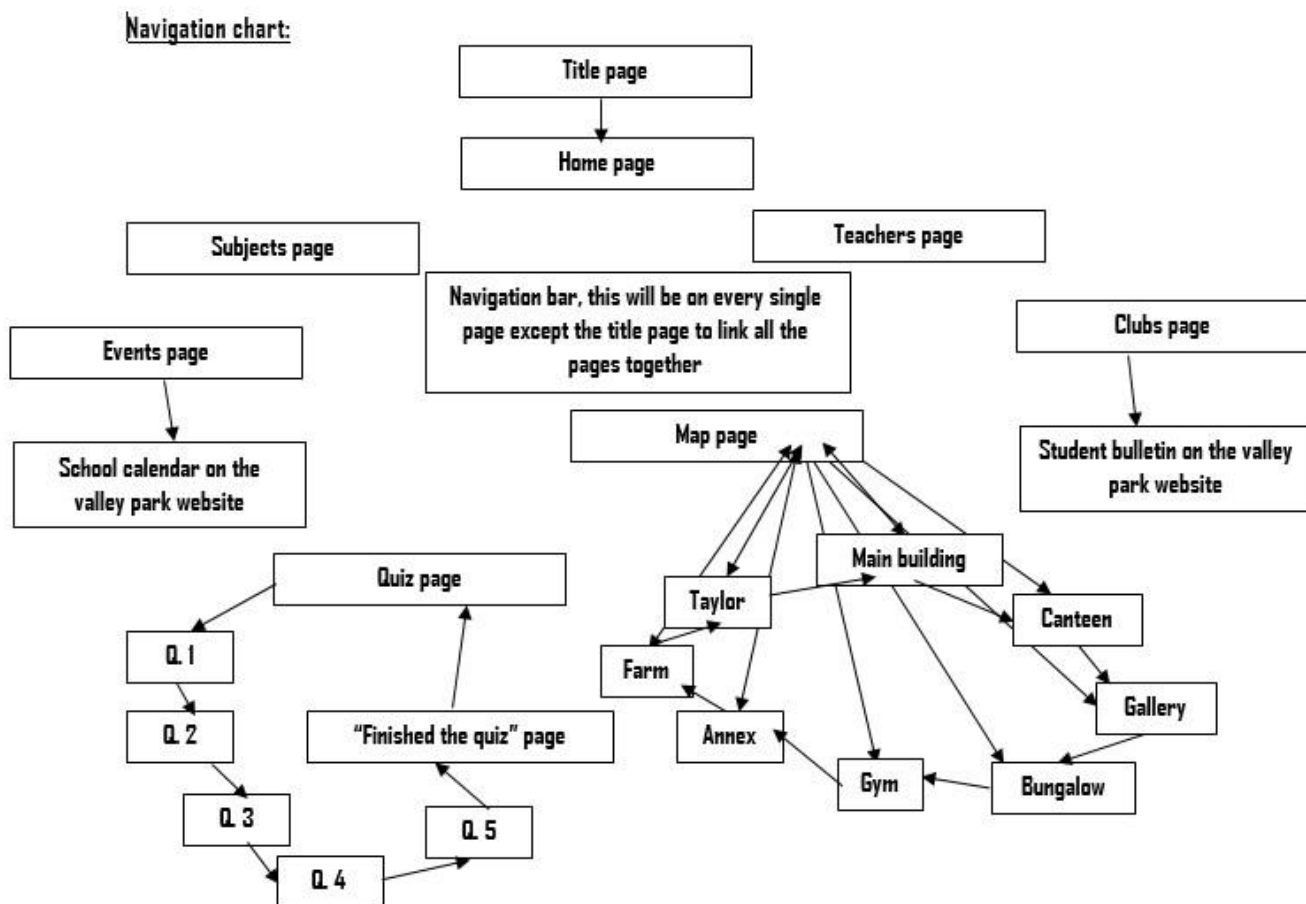
### **Video editing**

### **Animation**

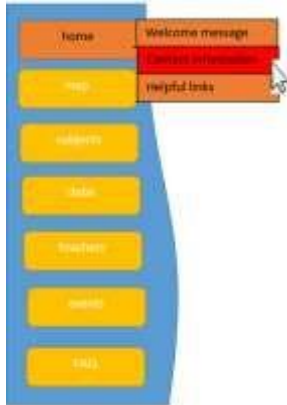
Animation is where you create a video by using either handmade/ drawn puppets/ models and moving them and taking an image or snapshot after every move and compiling them all to create one fluid motion or using computer software to program in a set sequence to a model or puppet constructed in the computer and recording its movement, this helps to improve the product as in an animation you can choose what happens, so the finished animation could potentially be more well suited to a final interactive media piece as you can choose what to implement and what to leave out, the sound in an animation is often edited as well. The video editing will be implemented into the software that I have chosen to use to create my final product.

### Navigation Chart



As the diagram show all my pages will be linked to one another via the navigation bar that will be found at the top of every page. The only exceptions are the external links on the clubs and events page that take the user to the school site, so they can obtain more information on the clubs at the school and events that will be taking place over the source of the school year, these links will be one way as the school site does not have a feature to return to the kiosk. The building pages will all have a separate button that links all the pages together in a loop and another button to link it back to the map page as well as a navigation bar to interconnect them with every other page, and the question pages in the quiz will all be connected in succession all leading back to the main quiz page. All of these pages will also have the navigation bar on them to link them to the other pages in the kiosk.

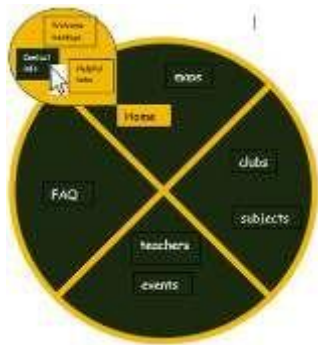

This links back to the brief as it uses mostly gender neutral colours and colours that are clear and mostly soft which makes it appeal to the wide range of ages that will be using the kiosk, and it looks very professional and smart, which is another requirement for the product, however it does not link in very well with the purpose of the product as it

does not hold any clear link with the school, e.g. colour scheme or font choice, and so it will probably not be the design I choose to use in the end because of this.

This links back to the brief as it uses mostly gender neutral, and it links in very well with the purpose of the product as it has a clear link with the school through the

colour scheme used, however it does not look all that professional as the buttons are all over the place and the circular design makes it hard to neatly fit onto the product so I don't think that I will use this design in my final product.

Interactivity- when the mouse hovers over a button, a drop-down list appears, in a semi-circle, with white text displaying the specific section of the page, and the text turns white and a white ring appears around

the text as well, the dropdown list then also has a rollover on it so that the text will turn white, on the button that is being hovered over. This design does not link back to the design brief very well as the colours are not very gender or age neutral, the design does not fit in with the colour scheme or font choice of the school and the design does not look all that professional due to the brightness of the colours used, so because of this I will be unlikely to use this design in my final product.

This design fits in well with the design brief as the colours are gender and age neutral and the text is very easy to read, it also looks professional and it is in the school colours making a clear link between the product and the school.

### **Colour Schemes**

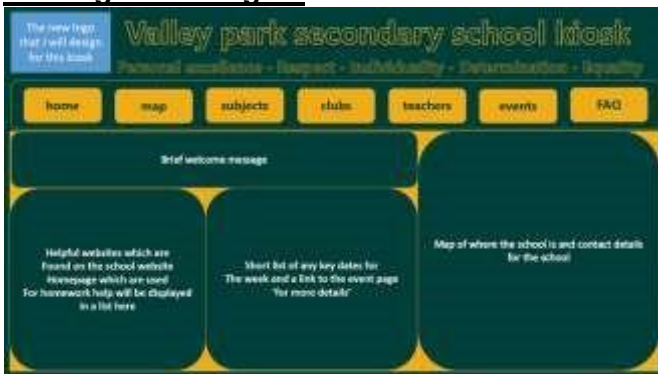
Here I have experimented with different colour schemes, using the home screen as the template. This is to help me get the perfect colour scheme for my final product, a scheme that appeals to my audience and meets the purpose. Below are 5 trial colour schemes with advantages and disadvantages for each one to help me pick out the best one, so that I can make the most user friendly and best possible product I can.

#### **Bright pink, dark blue and red**



Pink- red 245, green 57, blue 245/ Blue- red 0, green 0, blue 98/ Red- red 255, green 1, blue 6  
An advantage of this schemes is that it is bold and stands out, it will definitely catch the user's attention as I have used contrasting colours to make the text more apparent and the boxes have a subtler out line which makes them more complementary and nicer to look at. However, the colours are too bright and laree to keep your attention on the actual information you are wanting to get and makes this information very difficult to read. Although contrasting colours go together well, in this format it looks hideous and contrasting colours don't look as professional as complementary colours would which deviates from one of the main points in the design brief. The colour scheme is overall a terrible one as it appeals to very few people as bright pink and dark blue combo is a hard one to enjoy and would just discourage or distract the user from using this product for its intended purpose of informing you on info about the school.

**Bottle green and gold**



Green- red 0, green 63, blue 57/ Gold- red 240, green 173, blue 24

An advantage of this schemes is that it makes use of the school colours which makes it look more professional and immediately links the kiosk to the school so that it becomes apparent what this kiosks purpose is, and the user immediately knows that they can find out what they want to find out about this school here. It also uses colours that both complement each other so that it looks pleasing to the eye, but the colours also stand out from one another making the text readable. The use of mostly gender natural colours allows the kiosk to appeal to both genders and people of all ages which helps the kiosk appeal to the target audience. A disadvantage of this scheme is that the background colour is maybe too dark and might turn people off and might affect people who have a problem with their eyesight as some people might find reading white on a dark background harder than if it was a dark colour on a light background.

**Pale yellow and pale green**



Green- red 0, green 176, blue 80/ Yellow- red 243, green 188, blue 69

An advantages of this scheme is that it is much softer on the eyes than the last two designs, and the colours chosen somewhat resembling the school colours so users will clearly understand the link between the kiosk and the school, despite the link not being as apparent and doesn't quite link to showing the user the purpose of the kiosk, the colours are very gender neutral and easy for all ages to see and feel calm about, making this design appeal to my target audience more. However, a big disadvantage to this scheme is that the colours are so similar so reading the title and buttons is difficult and white on yellow for the text boxes is a not a very good choice as, again, the colour choices are too similar so reading will be difficult, defeating the purpose, which is to inform the students on the school and you can't do that if you can't read it.

**Font Experimentation**

Here I have experimented with different font choices, using the school name as the template. This is to help me get the perfect font for my final product, a font that appeals to my audience and meets the purpose. Below are 5 potential font choices with advantages and disadvantages for each one

to help me pick out the best one, so that I can make the most user friendly and best possible product I can.

All of my fonts will be in bold as I will be using bold text no matter what font I choose and personally I think that bold text looks nicer than regular text and is also easier to read. In will only use one font for both my titles and subheadings and the body of text with all the information in it, in my final product as I think that only using one font makes the product look more uniform and professional, so I will need to find a font that is eye catching for the title and easy to read for the main body.

### Segoe UI

An advantage of this font is that it is very clear to read and looks professional which meets one of the criteria of the design brief. Additionally, the font being easy to read allows everyone of all ages and genders to read it, meeting my audience and as it is a very clear font, it allows for the purpose to be clearly presented to the audience. However, this font is not all that interesting to look at and probably won't keep the user invested in the information I'm giving to them for very long because of this, this font also looks quite cold and harsh, which might make the product look more professional or too basic or oversophisticated turning people away.

### Comic Sans MS

An advantage of this font is that it is pleasant to look at and easy to read which allows everyone of all ages and genders to read it, meeting my audience and as it is a very clear font, it allows for the purpose to be clearly presented to the audience. However, this font is rather overused and not many people like this font because of it, so this could discourage people from using the kiosk or taking my product too seriously. Additionally, although all ages can read it and understand it clearly, it is still seen as a rather childish font as its mainly used in primary schools, so some users might feel a bit patronised using it because of this.

### Arial Narrow

probably won't keep the user invested in the information I'm giving to them for very long because of this.

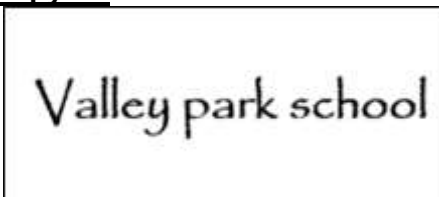

I think the Segoe UI font is the best one because it is the one that appeals the most to my audience and purpose and the one that I personally think is the one that fits the design brief the most and is the one that I like the most out of all the rest.

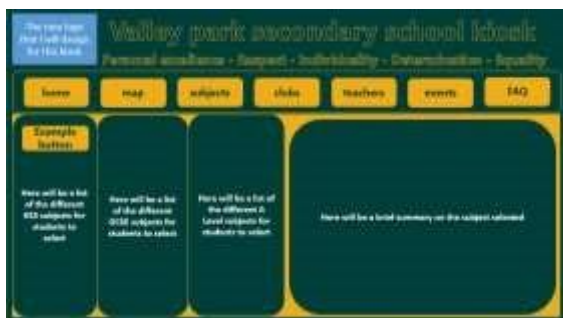

## **LO4: Review the proposal and the planning of an interactive media product**

### **Evaluation**

#### **Proposal**

Within the proposal document I first had to research what types of things are included in proposal documents and I found finding this information quite difficult. There wasn't that much information online about this and it took a lot longer than I expected to complete this stage of the planning documentation. Once I had spoken to my teacher and some of my peers about this we found that it was much easier to find the information that we needed. We worked together as a small group and found out what goes into a proposal document. I then had to take the research that I found and tailor it to meet with my project. I found writing the audience and purpose for the project very easy as I had already written this, and it is something that I can easily write lots of information about. I also found writing about my chosen platform and software quite easy as it is again something that I am used to doing. I am used to having to justify my decisions and explain why I have done something. I found writing about the background and content of the product a little more difficult. This is because I really had to start thinking about what going to go into my product and what types of things I would need to meet from the client. This took a lot of questioning and research to be able to explain my ideas. I also had to do some ignition plans on paper, so that I was able to explain my ideas fully. If I were to do this section of my task again, I think that I would make sure that I spent more time working on the content section of my proposal because I feel that this is the weakest part of the section. I would make sure that I had done my page designs first and then written about the content, as I would have a better understanding of exactly what I wanted to include.

#### **Project Plan**

The next stage of the project was to create a project plan that shows exactly what goes into each stage of development and I also needed to consider what I would do if anything went wrong. I found splitting up the development process easy, as I could work out what I needed to do and when. I think that I have been able to describe each of the stages of development very well and this will make sense to the client when they are reading my proposal. I also found allocating time to the stages quite easy, as I knew how long to spend on each area based on previous projects that we have done within class. The part that I found most difficult was the allocating contingency time to each stage. I wasn't sure how to plan this time in without making the project too long in length and making it unappealing to the client at the end. I had to have a conversation with some of my peers to help plan out this time and plan out exactly what could go wrong. We worked together with some of our ideas as a focus group and then went and worked on our own projects and their plans. If I were to do this again, I would definitely spend more time on the risk assessment part of the process and planning in my contingency time. I think that this would make my life much easier and I would have known a little more about what I was really meant to be writing in that section of the report.

#### **Navigation Chart / Navigation Bar Designs**

The next stage of the planning process was to create a navigation chart to plan out how all of my pages were going to be linked together. I found it easiest to make a list of all the pages that I wanted to create first and then I started to think about how they would be linked together. I then found it very easy to create the chart, as we had just created a practice one last lesson. It was easy to plan out the navigation chart and show all of the links and I am very happy with how it has turned out. I don't think I would make any improvements to the navigation chart, as it is easy to read and explain.

The next stage of the planning was to start thinking about what my navigation bar would look like. I experimented with lots of different designs when it came to my navigation bar and I am happy with the different styles. Overall, I think that the more simplistic designs look better because they are going to be the ones that are easiest to use and will make people want to use the product again and again. I don't think I would make any changes to the experimentation of my navigation bars as they are simple and effective. My peers said that they found my descriptions and notes very easy to follow and that is something that I am quite proud of as well.

### **Colour Schemes and Fonts**

The next stage of my planning was to create a simple homepage design for my product and then experiment with different colour schemes. I created a simple layout using PowerPoint and then used the colour tool to change the colours. I really tried to experiment with different colour schemes here and I think it made them all different and stand out from each other. I then went on to explain my choices of colours and help to justify my points, which I have also tried to explain fully in this written document. If I were to do the colour scheme experimentation again, I think I would maybe try a few more combinations of colours. This would let me make a much more informed decision about which one I would finally like to use and the reasons why I would like to use that final one. Although I am happy with my chosen one of green and golden colours.




Another experimentation that I did was with different font styles to use in my product. I tried a range of different fonts that I could have used in the product and really thought about where I could use them and on which pages. I think the Segoe UI font is the best one because it is the one that appeals the most to my audience and purpose and the one that I personally think is the one that fits the design brief the most and is the one that I like the most out of all the rest. I am happy with this decision and think that it will make my final product look very professional and clear and easy to read the information within it.



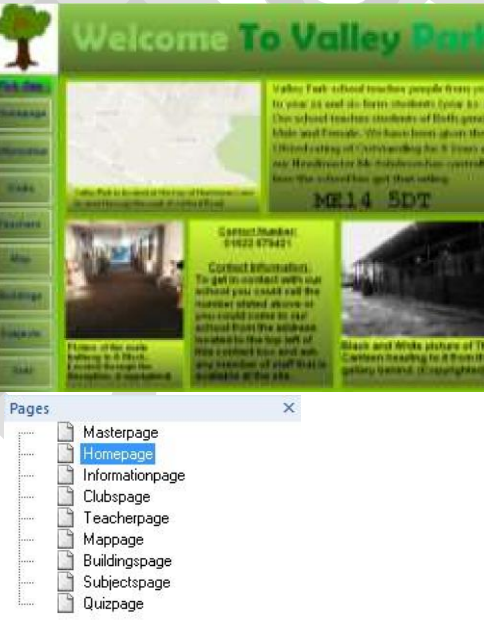
### **Page Designs**



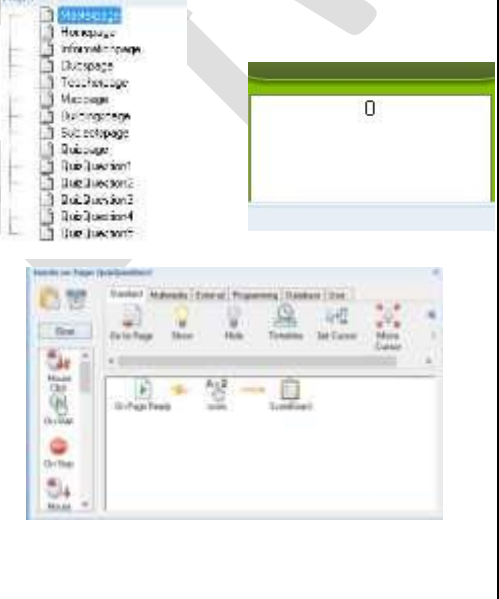

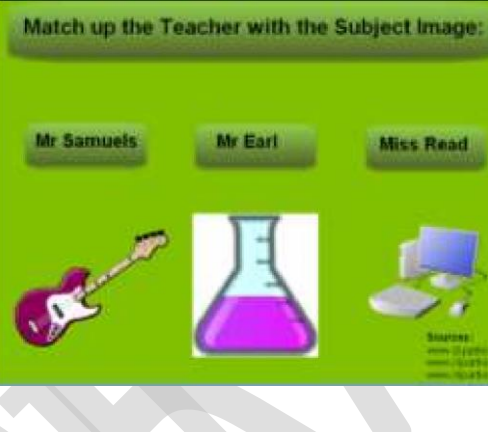

### **LO3: Review their finished interactive media product**

#### **Questionnaire Analysis**

1: The Strengths of my product are the way that the pages are laid out. The Product starts with the Login Page and then after you smoothly enter your Name the Product Transfers you to the Homepage where you are presented with a roundup of information and pictures also including the logo welcome title and the navigation bar that can transfer you to any page that you want to learn more about. This meets the Audience and Purpose because of how the product has to relate around all ages.

2: A Weakness of My Product would be the Colour Scheme. The colour scheme apparently is a bit unprofessional and needs to be changed a bit. I can see that and can agree that the green could be a little darker and be a bit less green as well, Gold colour would have been good mixed with the green, but it will do. The colour could fit in with the audience and purpose if it was a bit darker and fit in a bit more.

3: The improvements I could make according to my questionnaire would be to change some of the colours in the different pages, this would allow me to make the product look much more professional and to make it much more better looking and to be graded higher from people who want it to look good for the school.

4: The Improvement I think I could make would be to make the title on the main pages look much better because for me at least, when I look at it, it looks like it could be improved and I would have liked to improve it maybe by changing the font or making the colours of the text look a little more dark green and make them all the same colour. The green is ok, but it needs to be darker and to look smoother instead of different shades, I was going for a multiple leaf like colour but it's ok.

#### **Evaluation**

One reason why my Interactive Multimedia Product meets the Audience is because of how the layout is simple and easy to manoeuvre around so that people very young or people very old will be able to use the machine as long as they know how buttons work. Another reason is because of the colours that my product is made up of, they allow the product to be visually seen by anyone in the sunlight or at night and they stand out so that my audience is able to see it better. The last reason is because my product has a very big and easy to read font, the font also has clear colours that make it up and allow it to be read with ease helping the audience.

One reason why my Interactive Multimedia product reaches the purpose is because it contains a map of the school and includes all of the locations needed so that the audience can find out where to go next in school if they need directions. Another reason is because the Product contains a New and Clean Logo that appears on all the slides it is needed on this is an improvement I am happy with because of its nice design and placement in the top left corner so that all of my audience can see it and understand its purpose. The last reason is because of how my product contains all the information needed for new and returning visitors to the school, the information is presented mainly on the information page but also some on the Homepage.

One main reason why my Interactive Multimedia product reaches the User Requirements is because I have included many of the items I was going to include in my user requirements in my Final Product. This includes a new logo, the school name, a detailed map, a List of teachers and subjects, a list of available clubs, various colours, a navigation bar, information about Valley Park, a homepage and It needs to be suitable for my Audience. All of these items being included in my Product means that it will be very useful for any member of my audience to find out facts about Valley Park in a suitable simple manner.

One way my product could meet more audiences is by containing more features that the generations in years 8-10 are into at that point. After using the Kiosk a few times, the quiz and Drag and Drop activity



will get boring so something new will be required to entertain the other years. Another way my product could reach more audiences is by adding new colours or maybe new sections for the older years so that they can experience a product ready for them and something they would be happy with compared to the current product.

One way my product could meet more purposes is by allowing visitors to know where to go at certain events such as leading them to the gallery at open evening, because at the moment we need signs and people to show where to go. Another way my product could meet more purposes is by telling students and carers when days are off and why they are off, For example half term, Bank holiday, Snow Days and more.

One strength of my product is how you can easily go to any section you want and be greeted by what you were looking for, such as if you want information about the school you go to the information page and if you want to know where buildings are then you go to the map page and then find there you can find out what building holds your next destination. Another strength is that my product has information but at the same time allows students to have an amusing time on the quiz and drag and drop activity and it will also boost their knowledge of the school.

One weakness of my product that would be very hard to accomplish but amazing to do, is to have a recent news section at the side of some pages to show everyone what the school is up too and what's going on, on certain days, that would improve the product by encouraging my audience and others to return to my product to check out the latest news. I would include this into my product by making the design responsive and linking it up to the school website. This mean that any changes to the school website would automatically become onto the product and it would make a recent news page or sliding bar on the screen.

Another weakness of my product is how the clubs page is a bit messy, it was hard to fit in the pictures so that they didn't have a low resolution, so I fit them in as well as I could, but it was still hard to make them incredibly clear, but I tried to make them more high resolution, but It could definitely be improved. I would need to make changes to these images within the asset development of my process. This would allow me to select images that are higher quality and something that people will want to see in feature. I have also selected a range of different aspects that meet the needs of the client and will be interesting for people to see.

Another area that I found very boring was creating the lesson tracker to show my progress over time. I felt that it was important to show how I had improved my work during the lessons, but it soon became something very boring that I needed to complete during lessons and I felt that it was a chore to complete. If I were to do this again I would definitely change this lesson tracker to make it much smaller in length and easier to follow, so that I didn't have to make so many updates all of the time to it.

Overall my product is high quality and I am happy with the final product, some things could be improved around my product, some minor and some a big larger but I am not available to improve on some of these problems and some other things will take long time to work on which I am cannot do at this time. I will work on these problems in my next Product.

## **Unit 4 – Present and promote an interactive media product**

### **LO1: Understand how to promote their skills and present an interactive media product in the creative media industry**

#### **Purpose of Presenting Interactive Media Products**

There are many different reasons why we need to present interactive media products to people. One reason that we may need to present an interactive media product is because a company is pitching a completed product to a client or customer. This might be when a company has been awarded a new contract to produce marketing material for a new school or product. This means that the company will need to present its products to a team of people from the client company. The clients will want to see what the company can offer, and it will also give them a chance to ask any questions they have and for the company pitching the idea to get any feedback they think will be very useful. For example, if the client doesn't really like the colour of the product, then the company could change the colour based on feedback that they have got from the client during the pitch. It's important that a pitch goes well as it will ensure that the company has new business and can do well in the future.

Another reason for presenting an interactive media product might be to test a product with its intended audience. It's very important that new media products are tested and improved based on feedback from the audience. This is called iterative development and is an important part of the software development lifecycle. By following this process, it will ensure that the company designing the product can get accurate feedback and then use this to refine their product and make it better and more suited for their audience. This will make the client happier and more interested in purchasing the final product.

A company may also choose to present an interactive media product because they are competing with other companies to try and win a new contract with a client. The company would need to present their ideas and any prototypes they have created to the customer and then show them exactly what they could offer them. It's important that the products shown show the company off in a good light because they are then more likely to get the final job. It's very competitive in this industry and people want to do well so that their businesses can stay on track and in the same position to earn money.

Not only will some companies want to show off products at a pitch they may also want to show off their products to other professionals at an event, like a conference or trade show. If a company were able to show off their product well in this kind of situation then they are likely to get good publicity and encourage new companies to consider them as being someone who could make an interactive media product for them. It is also a good opportunity for the company to show off any particular products they have been working on, such as a new game or application. Another reason that an interactive media product might need to be presented is because the company creating them may want to generate awareness of a new game or application with its audience. This means that the company might want to show off what they have done at a gaming convention or education conference if their app is to do with teaching.

A final reason that interactive media products might need to be presented is because someone is applying for a job in this industry and they need to show off the skills and products that they have worked on before. This is because within interviews and application process for jobs in the creative industry you are expected to show off your practical skills and show off what you are able to do. This means that a company is more likely to hire you because you have practical experience and they can see what you have done. Sometimes in an interview you will be expected to complete a face-to-face presentation of your product and talk the interviewers through what you have done and how you have developed. Another way might be to produce an interactive portfolio to show off exactly what you have done and then the company you are applying to can go through this in their own time.

## Methods of presenting Interactive Media Products

- This is when an individual creates a presentation to show off their skills and some of the products they have made. This presentation may include print screens of their products and speaker notes to help them present their ideas well. The person presenting will speak about everything they have done in a face-to-face environment and can use the slides to provide practical examples of an interactive media product.
- Some advantages of using a presentation are that they are quite easy to create and people without a lot of technical knowledge would be able to do this. Another advantage is that they are easily used by many people and they can be easy to view on lots of different devices.
- Some disadvantages of using a presentation is that they are not very interactive can be quite boring to really show off what you have done. A presentation also have quite

- This is generally a website that is created by an individual or company that shows off the different skills and products that the creator has done. The digital portfolio acts as a showcase of their work and it is important that it is laid out correctly and works properly too.
- Some advantages of using a digital portfolio are that are good for showing off work for more than one project at the same time. This means that many new skills and different products would be able to be seen. It also allows for different types of products to be included. The types of products can include moving image, audio, games, apps and websites. Also the portfolio is quite easy to update with new material and they are quite cheap to produce in comparison with other areas.

- A disadvantage of using a digital portfolio is that they can often be time consuming to build and it takes time to make a really effective digital portfolio. It's important to make sure that they are as professional as possible. Also digital portfolios can often have large file sizes because of the amount of files included within them. This means that they will be harder to distribute to people. However, they could be posted online.

- This is a marketing campaign that is based around people sharing something with lots of other people and then them sharing it with lots of other people as well. This then develops and becomes something that is known as "viral". This is good because it means that lots of people are talking about the object or thing that has been shared. In order to make this an interactive media product then the actual product would need to be shared online - often viral marketing comes from the use of social media, as so many people use it often. This is going to need a lot of investment from people to make this work well.
- An advantage of using viral marketing is that they are free to distribute, as it relies on the audience sharing the ideas rather than an investment from a company. They can also be very successful if enough people share them. There will be interest developed from the audience and the people who are sharing the product.

- A disadvantage of using this method is that it's hard to identify a specific audience because they are often used in association with the audience and purpose and social media. It's hard to know what people will want to share and what they won't. It's often unreliable to use this method because they can be hard to create viral products because it's what people will be interested in.

- This is when a product is released onto the web for people to see. This often involves the use of websites or sharing something via emails. An online presence would allow people to share their work with others and make sure that everyone is happy with their work. It is often used as a collaborative tool to let people work together and share their ideas. It would let lots of people see an interactive media product and make sure that they are completely happy with it before anything else happens.
- An advantage of using an online presence is that it would be able to showcase a wide range of types of products because games and apps can be included in the product. Also HTML and CSS can be used to showcase even more skills that the user had developed. This would impress the audience of the presentation method more. Online presence is also good because it means that more people would be able to access it and view their work that the person has done. This means that more people would be impressed by their skills and the products they have made.
- A disadvantage of using an online presence is that require quite a good understanding of the technical skills in making a website. This means that it would need to be a professional who makes this type of product and spends a lot of time on it. This means that some people would not be able to make this type of product or spend time making it with the skills needed. Also it can take quite a lot of time to update these types of products.

- This is a video that is used to showcase an interactive media product and can often be used in a variety of different ways, such as sharing online or simply being shown in an interview. Sometimes people like to use these promotional videos with animations and voice overs within them to explain some areas of the interactive media product. I also think that some people will want to know exactly how certain things work and this video is a chance for them to show this. These videos can be uploaded to video sharing websites, such as YouTube and Vimeo.
- An advantage of using this method to promote an interactive media product is that they are ideal for moving image projects because that's what a video is based upon. They are also quite easy to distribute to the professionals who need access to it. They are easy to share via email or online sources.

### Promotional

- A disadvantage is that they are not always suitable for all types of products. This is because work that is reliant on text would not really fit into a promotional video. Also it's quite hard to edit a video once it has been made and this means any new projects that someone works on will not be able to be included in the new product. It can also be quite time consuming to make these types of products because there is so much editing involved in them.

## Methods of Presenting Skills

### Showreel

- This is a video that is often used to show off the skills that people have developed. They often have moving images and voice overs to explain the ideas.
- An advantage of using a showreel is that they are ideal for moving image, gaming and audio skills as they are all graphical in basis. Also it is a good way to demonstrate practical skills and creativity, as the showreel itself is a creative interactive product. It would provide an opportunity to stand out from the competition. They are free and easy to distribute digitally amongst people.
- A disadvantage is that they are not always suitable for all types of products. This is because work that is reliant on text would not really fit into a promotional video. Also it's quite hard to edit a video once it has been made and this means any new projects that someone works on will not be able to be included in the new product. It can also be quite time consuming to make these types of products because there is so much editing involved in them.

### Digital CV

- This is generally a website that is created by an individual or company that shows off the different skills and products that the creator has done. These products include a commentary of their work and often have download links to the work that they have done as well.
- Some advantages of using a digital cv are that are good for showing off work for more than one project at the same time. This means that many new skills and different products would be able to be seen. It also allows for different types of products to be included. The types of products can include moving image, audio, games, apps and websites. Also the cv is quite easy to update with new material and they are quite cheap to produce in comparison with other areas.
- A disadvantage of using a cv is that they can often be time consuming to build and it takes time to make a really effective cv. It's important to make sure that they are as professional as possible. Also cvc can often have large file sizes because of the amount of files included within them. This means that they will be harder to distribute to people. However, they could be posted online.

### Exhibitions

- This is a physical way of presenting work. This involves setting up a presentation or exhibition of the skills that the person has been building. This needs to show how things have developed and improved.
- An advantage of using this method is that the person who was making this will have creative control over the products/skills on show. For example they will be able to control the lighting and sound that is used and they will be able to speak about how things are done. Using this method will often be more interesting for the audience and it will be something they can remember and will stick in their minds. It is likely to make a better impression on the audience. By doing a practical presentation the presenter will be able to meet with the audience and explain their products or ideas in more detail.
- A disadvantage of this is that it can be expensive to hire a venue and arrange lighting or sounds to be played. It also relies on people choosing to attend the event and there may not be very many people who will go to this. It's also temporary and isn't something that people will be able to view again and again.

### Web Presence

- This is when a product is released onto the web for people to see. This often involves the use of websites or sharing something via emails. An online presence would allow people to share their work with others and make sure that everyone is happy with their work. It is often used as a collaborative tool to let people work together and share their ideas. It would let lots of people see an interactive media product and make sure that they are completely happy with it before anything else happens.
- An advantage of using an online presence is that it would be able to showcase a wide range of types of products because games and apps can be included in the product. Also HTML and CSS can be used to showcase even more skills that the user has developed. This would impress the audience of the presentation more. Online presence is also good because it means that more people would be able to access it and view their work that the person has done. ### Purposes of presenting Interactive Media Products

When presenting interactive media products there are lots of different clients that a company or individual may need to present to. There are a range of different ages and purposes. When presenting to a specific audience it's important that the type of presentation method used is appropriate and suits the needs.

### **Researching IT Job Roles**

I am describing different roles in the interactive media industry and what each role does, the qualifications needed, the personal attributes that are preferable and any other notes such as what the job requires you to do. For this I have picked out 5 different roles and for each, written about them using the details listed above.

### **Web designer**

For this job you use creative and technical skills to design new websites and redesign existing ones. The average salary is around £18,000 to £40,000 annually. For this job you would meet with clients to discuss the briefing, preparing a design plan, deciding on branding, texts, colours and backgrounds, laying out pages and positioning buttons, links and pictures on design software, adding in multimedia, testing and improving, uploading to a server and you might need to work closely with web developers and marketing professionals.

No qualifications are really needed, however there are web design college courses which offer a degree in web design which can help in getting a job in this field, but the employee needs to show skills in; visual design, search engine optimisation (SEO), marketing and social media, using coding software like HTML and CSS, using photo editing software, Photoshop and adobe illustrator and basic copywriting skills.

The personal attributes that are preferable in this job are; strong creative skills, the ability to pay attention to detail, good problem solving skills, logical approach to work, good social and communication skills, the ability to explain technical matters clearly and the ability to work within deadlines. This suggests that it's very important to show off all of my personal skills within my own presentation document so that I would be able to show off the well-rounded individual that I am. Having a section about personal attributes is going to be important within my own product.

### **Video creator- animator**

For this job you bring drawings and computer-generated characters to life on the screen. You will create animations and short videos that include animations and you would need to have the basics of these skills before you even start working. The average salary is around £14,000 to £36,000 annually.

An employer would mainly be looking for an animation or art related HDN, foundation degree, degree or post graduate course, another thing an employer would be looking for is a portfolio of examples of your work, and it is advised to entering animating completions, festivals or sending of ideas and animation to broadcasters or uploading them to videos platforms such as YouTube, this helps to get your name in the industry. This advert suggests that the portfolio that I create needs to showcase the real skills and important areas that I have worked on. The portfolio is going to act as a showcase of work, so it's important that all areas are explained and clear.

Personal attributes that are looked for is; creativity and imagination, drawing and modelling skills, communication and presentation skills, IT skills and good leadership and team working skills.

### **Creative copywriter**

For this job you create an add detail to websites and any form of written text online. You are responsible for writing unique web content for lots of different clients. You may have to create and edit blog posts for customers and make sure that all of your spelling is correct and well organised. You work as part of a team and need to make sure that you are able to meet deadlines and find out all of the information that you need. You also need to be able to respond to feedback given to the clients and help make decisions that will help them improve their websites. You also have to be able to newspaper articles and anything else important that would be worthwhile. The average salary is around £14,000 to £60,000 annually.

An employer would mainly be looking for a creative copywriter to have at least a year's worth of experience in writing for an online platform, such as a blog or website editor. They wouldn't expect you to have a degree or any formal qualification, but GCSEs in English are essential.

Personal attributes that they are looking for are: Excellent written English with impeccable spelling and grammar, a genuine passion for creative writing, the ability to create compelling copy in a timely manner to meet deadlines, excellent proofreading skills, good research skills, teamworking and experience of social media.

### **Digital reporter**

A digital reporter is very similar to a creative copywriter as they are both based around writing content for online platforms. However, a digital reporter specialises in reporting about things that are happening in the news. These types of people will report on special events or things that are happening around the world. They will need to be available to travel and enjoy the world of something that is ever changing. People will need to be confident in working with lots of information and working out what is true and what is false.

Again, there are no formal qualifications needed, but many companies ask their candidates to have a thorough knowledge of the IPSO Code of Conduct, media law and ethical considerations. This means people need to have experience of working on a newspaper or other area where these things will be present. I also notice that to apply for the role you have to send CV and breakdowns of contributions to storyboards. This means that I would need to include an electronic CV within my product to really show off what I have done and how I have progressed.

Personal attributes that they are looking for are: Excellent written English with impeccable spelling and grammar, a genuine passion for creative writing, the ability to create compelling copy in a timely manner to meet deadlines, excellent proofreading skills, good research skills, teamworking and experience of social media.



### **Media content editor**

A media content editor is someone who creates and edits the content that goes into a range of different products. They are people who can make animations, banners and other graphical features of a website. They are creative people who have a wide range of skills and can work as part of a larger team of organisers.

Most employers ask for a degree in a media related course, such as Media Studies or Creative Media Editorial degrees. They ask for people to have a portfolio of evidence to show what they have created and for their specific audiences. Many employers want their people to know exactly what they need and why they need it. One recurring theme in all of these job adverts is that they would like people who have lots of enthusiasm and understanding of the latest trends and technologies. This shows the dedication of the applicant in all of the things technology and the industry they are working within.

The personal attributes that they are looking for are: Understanding of HTML and Video specifications. They ask for excellent verbal communication skills due to the amount of collaborative work with other people. They ask that people are team players and have good technical understandings.

### **Audience and Purpose**

To meet the brief for Task 1 I have chosen to use a digital portfolio to showcase my work and all of the skills that I have developed over the course of the last 5 months. I have chosen to use a digital portfolio because I believe that it will be the best suited to the audience and it will allow me to show off all of the documents that I have produced whilst also adding in commentary to explain them and how I felt about each of the units of work. A digital portfolio is also something that is asked for by many jobs that I have researched, so I want to have something that I can really show off to lots of people and make them very impressed with my work and everything that I have done.

The audience of my product is going to be professional people who work within the Marketing department. This is because the digital portfolio is going to be used as part of an interview process and needs to be something that is professional in the way that it works. The product needs to appeal to both genders, because the department and people who interview me might be of both genders and it's important to consider these areas well. The purpose of the product is to try and get a job in the marketing department after my 6 month's probation. It is also to showcase all of my work and who I am as a person.

something that plays on my website. If I were given more time, I would add the video to my digital portfolio so that it plays on my homepage and the interactive media

An improvement I would make to my product to make sure that it meets the audience and purpose better is to include a show reel on the homepage that I could use to introduce myself and show off some of my teachers to show what they think are important. #### **Justification for the awarded grade:**

For LO1, the learner has produced a range of evidence to describe a range of features that could be used in the development of an interactive media product. They have also produced a document that describes some of the main processes and techniques that are also used in the development of an interactive media product. The learner has also produced some descriptions of the sources of information that can be used in creating an interactive media product and provided clear steps to explain how they might be used. The learner has also described the audience and purpose of their own interactive media product. They have also described a range of health and safety issues that are involved in the use of computers and the development of interactive media products. For LO2, the learner has experimented with a range of different image editing software, colour schemes, solutions, font styles, navigation bar designs and hardware for their own product. For LO3, the learner has then created a review to describe what they have done and a range of strengths and weaknesses of each stage of the development.

Overall, the evidence of exploration of the aspects involved in the creation of an interactive media product is detailed and the learner has drawn clear conclusions about what links the areas together. Although here is some vague description of links between techniques and processes, there are clear links between each of the techniques and how they come together to make a final product. The learner has provided a wide range of evidence of how their experimentation has helped them to develop their ideas and plans. There are clear and consistent links back to the brief that show this has been considered at all times. The review produced by the learner details and explains a range of strengths and weaknesses in their experimentation. There is also a clear indication of whether their final design was a success or not.

#### **Unit 2:**

For LO1, the learner has conducted research into what makes a proposal document. The learner has conducted research into the different technical aspects that might be involved in the proposal document and any features that are included in the final product. They have explained these areas in detail and linked them back to the original client brief. For LO2 and LO3, the learner has created a detailed proposal for their own interactive media product. They have explored existing products and considered the different audience and purpose of each. They have explained the key points of each product and how they will come together. There is also some consideration of the tools and techniques that the learner will use, along with a detailed description of the house style and chosen platform. The learner has provided some detailed page designs and annotations to show the overall layout of their product. The learner has produced a project plan, navigation chart and navigation bar designs and colour schemes and typography experimentation. The learner has shown clear page plans for their own product. For LO4, the learner has then created a review to describe what they have done and some strengths and weaknesses of each stage they have gone through.

Overall within the exploration and production of a proposal document, the learner has identified and described what is required. There is a clear and detailed description of the key areas and how they all link together. The learner has attempted to fully justify their choices and give reasons for their decisions.

The learner has also used technical terms and skills consistently in their write-up. There are clear links to the original design brief as well. The exploration of images and videos uses a range of technical terms and addresses the features of each type of image and video. Within the evidence for LO2 and LO3 the learner has described problems they may encounter during the development of their product and planning documents. They have clearly explained how they have built contingency plans into their project log. The planning documents produced by the learner show some clear and consistent use of technical skills in meeting the brief. There are clear methods of addressing problems that arise. The review produced by the learner details and explains a range of strengths and weaknesses in their experimentation. There is also a clear indication of whether their final design was a success or not.

### **Unit 3:**

The learner has produced evidence to show how their images were manipulated and described the tools and software used to do this. The learner has created a lesson tacker to outline the process they followed to create their final product and also explained the tools they have used. The learner has also provided evidence of their folder structure and advanced testing of their product. There is also a written review to outline a range of improvements that could be made to the final product along with how it meets the audience and purpose.

The evidence produced by the learner shows a wide range of technical skill and technical terminology when using different software packages, such as Photoshop and Mediator. They have provided a range of examples and detailed descriptions of the key technical areas. Within the lesson tracker the learner has addressed a series of simple problems that occurred and explained how they addressed and solved them. The learner has successfully met all areas of the original brief and all areas of their final product fully work as expected. Within the lesson tracker the learner has also described how they have combined their technical skills together to make the final product. The learner has produced a detailed evaluation that explains how their final product meets the original audience and purpose. There is also a clear explanation of some advanced improvements that could be made to their product.

### **Unit 4:**

For LO1, the learner has provided research into a range of presentation methods and outlined the use of each. The learner has described methods of presenting their skills and also presenting their final multimedia product. The learner has also conducted research in a range of jobs and the skills that are needed in each. The learner has described their chosen presentation method and suggested some specific presentation methods that would match a range of scenarios. For LO2, the learner has produced a detailed and imaginative digital portfolio that provides links to all of the evidence produced for the remaining units of internal assessments. They have linked all of the pages and included download content for each unit completed. They have used HTML and CSS to control the overall appearance of their website and include some advanced features of the product such as rollover images and animations. For LO3, the learner has completed a detailed review of their digital portfolio outlining a range of strengths and weaknesses of each stage of development they went through.

The evidence produced by the learner for LO1 is detailed and makes clear conclusions about how they will produce their own presentation product. The learner has conducted research into different job titles and provided links between their research and their own brief and the product they will be making. Although there is a poor layout to their evidence in some places the links between their research have been highlighted within the job research. The learner has also explored range of scenarios in the interactive media industry and has explained their choice of presentation methods, showing clear consideration of the audience and purpose of each. The learner has drawn clear conclusions from their research in order to justify their choices. The portfolio produced by the learner shows a wide range of technical skills, and there is clear evidence to show how different equipment and materials have been combined together to produce their final product. The learner has shown great consideration of the audience and purpose when making their product and including their key evidence and skills description.

The learner would need to develop their evidence to show this in more detail to increase their grade. The review produced by the learner explains a wide range of strengths and weaknesses of their digital portfolio. There is reference to the overall impact of their product and they have created a table to show consideration of the importance of the improvements they wish to make.
