Level 2 Playworker mapping guidance

This document details how the NCFE CACHE Level 2 Diploma in Playwork (610/0643/9) maps to the Level 2 ST0867 Playworker apprenticeship standard.

The following guidance is intended to support centres who have apprentices wishing to undertake this qualification as part of their Level 2 Playworker apprenticeship.

The mapping guidance identifies links to the knowledge, skills and behaviours (KSBs) of the apprenticeship standard. Whilst it is not a mandated requirement to complete the qualification in order to achieve the apprenticeship standard, this qualification will support the apprentice to meet the KSBs and prepare them for their end-point assessment (EPA).

The mapping table illustrates how units within the NCFE CACHE Level 2 Diploma in Playwork (610/0643/9) meet the occupational KSBs of the Level 2 Playworker apprenticeship standard.

Additional delivery and assessment guidance is provided in this document to ensure all criteria within the standard are covered in full.
