About this qualification

The purpose of this qualification is to increase learners' awareness and understanding of diabetes. The objectives of this qualification are to gain knowledge and understanding of diabetes, including:

- the types, causes, signs and symptoms of diabetes
- anatomy and physiology
- the impact of diabetes on individuals, others and society
- the treatment and management of diabetes
- common complications of diabetes

There are no specific recommended prior learning requirements for this qualification, however, learners may find it helpful if they have already achieved a Level 2 qualification in a related subject

To be awarded the Certificate, learners are required to successfully complete 4 mandatory units.

Unit 02 Diabetes in context
Unit 03 Understand the treatment and management of diabetes
Unit 04 Understand the complications of diabetes

Assessment

This qualification is assessed via an internally assessed portfolio of evidence.
