In Document 2 Jacqui and Marta agree [1 mark] mention both documents with a brief, possibly implicit comparison – e.g. Document 1 states the air will be cleaner and Jacqui says Becton now has less pollution. Document 1 says residents are in favour, but in Document 2 Sule and Annie disagree [2 marks] use both documents to compare information, ideas and opinions clearly and effectively - eg Document 1 says the air will be cleaner and in Document 2 Adam/Jacqui support this, although Annie contradicts it. Document 1 says there'll be diversions/less room for traffic, and Document 2 shows how this will affect working people. [3 marks]. 0 marks should be given for no awardable content. 	3	2.10
